REFUND & TRANSFER POLICY FOR ALL EVENTS:

Refund and transfer requests must be made (5) business days prior to the EVENT less a \$15 processing Fee per person. Day Tours: may be canceled up to 10 days prior to departure date less a \$15 processing Fee. A refund will only be issued if your space can be re-sold. You may send a substitute in place. Multi Day Tours: Travel Protection insurance is highly recommended. A refund will be issued less a \$50 cancellation Fee. Non receipt of confirmation does not warrant a refund for any EVENT.

RETURNED CHECKS & REFUNDS BY CHECK, CASH OR MONEY ORDER:

REMOTE LIVE

Participants use an online platform to meet instead of a classroom. Your class will be held at a set class time where you will meet with your teacher and classmates.



ONLINE

This class is 100% online and there is not a set class time. You take part in learning activities on an online learning platform. You communicate with your instructor through online discussions, video recordings, and class activities.



IN PERSON

This type of class takes place in person. Participants are required to wear face covering and practice social distancing.



REMOTE BLENDED 1:

REMOTE BLENDED 2:

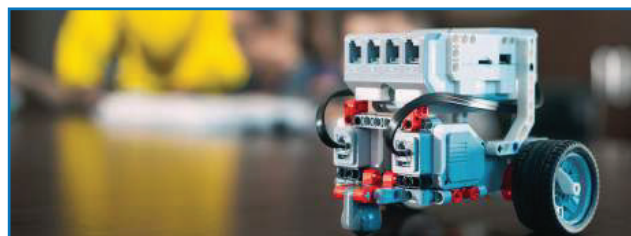

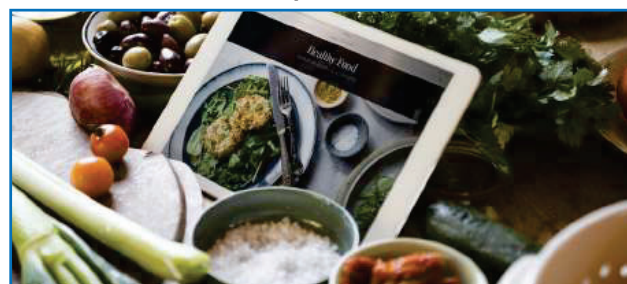

While Los Angeles is less than 180 years old it has suffered the loss of classic old cinemas, Victorian hotels, and grand railroad stations but recently L.A. has seen an amazing rebirth. On this unique tour, we'll see how Los Angeles has transformed from a tiny pueblo into a sprawling metropolis that is still developing at an incredible pace. We'll begin in L.A.'s downtown historic core where it all began. Enjoy lunch on your own at Philippe The Original - the L.A. icon that is known as the inventor of the French dip. Note that this tour has limited walking as it is mostly a driving tour with stops at each location - we do not tour inside the stadiums.

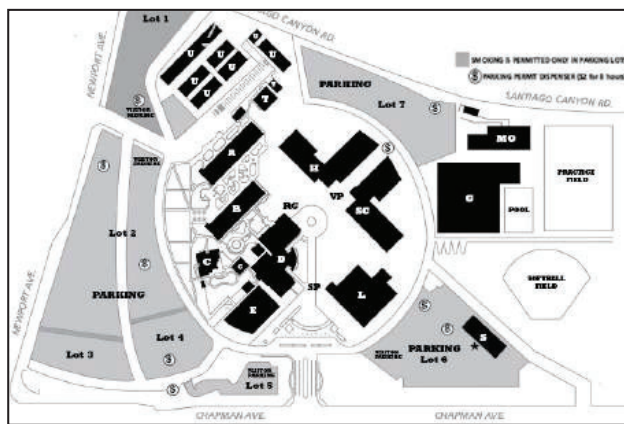
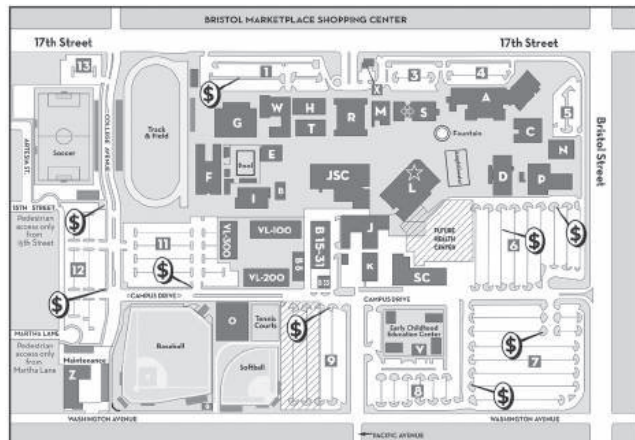
