The Woodrow Wilson Model United Nations Team is the largest, prestigious, and one of the most successful clubs at WWMS. From Best Delegation, to Outstanding Delegate, to International Conferences, this club has experienced it all. In this article, you will hear from club advisors Ms.Mohammed and Ms.Sackie about their experiences, achievements, and goals for the club in the coming months, as well as future plans. I interviewed both Ms.Mohammed and Ms.Sackie in a Zoom call, asking them insightful questions about the success of the club, and here are their answers.



A) What are some qualities or skills that are possessed by every member of the Model United Nations Team?

Ms.Mohammed: "I think a lot of it depends on what we look for when finding 6th graders to be part of the club. When we did the filtering process this year, we really looked for dedication, diplomacy, responsibility, having good public speaking skills"

Ms.Sackie: "We also look for maturity because a lot of the topics that students encounter especially 6th graders are extremely controversial and likely not anything that have encountered before in elementary school so we need to know if they would be academically and emotionally able to tackle such sensitive topics like gun trade."

B) What are some achievements that the Model UN club has had this year or overall and how do you feel about them?

Ms.Sackie: "We won best delegation at JAMUN and Horace Mann, so we are very excited about that and extremely proud of all the delegates who participated. Even if they did not win an award individually, they still helped make our delegation stand out amongst others."

Ms.Mohammed: "I think what people usually forget is that Model UN is not just an individual "sport," it more of a team effort so you have to be a team player and that working with others is also something that we look for. It is an interpersonal club and depends on communication, and so we are proud of the fact that the delegates came together with that win. We were especially proud of our win at Horace Mann going to that conference for the first time as it was a whole different playing field and we were competing against a lot of private schools so we were extremely proud of the team."

c) What are some of the goals for the club and the rest of the school year and beyond?

Ms.Mohammed: "This is something that Ms.Sackie and I go back to frequently and we always brainstorm and see what we want to achieve. Before the pandemic,it was getting to as many conferences as possible or holding a Woodrow Conference but now it is what we can do in a virtual setting. A goal that we have is doing well at UNA-USA which is an international conference and make the best of the situation. We really still somehow hope to host Woodrow conference and for our 6th graders to have that experience"

Ms.Sackie: "Another goal that we have is to plan an end-of-year celebration to congratulate all of the member on their accomplishments and sticking through this in such a tough virtual environment"

d) What is something that you do frequently in club meetings that you feel as an advisor makes the biggest difference in a delegate's overall performance at conferences?

Ms.Sackie: "You might have noticed that I am more of the comic relief by using role play to act out what to do and what not to do and just sort of help students visualize those habits that students should emulate or avoid."

Ms.Mohammed: "In terms of everything we do, what makes the most difference is practice. It's easy to just teach someone through presentations and give notes, anyone can do that. I think that in terms of Model UN, it is a participatory sport, so you have to engage and that is why we put that emphasis on conferences."

Ms.Sackie: "The student officers have also been a tremendous help to us, especially in this virtual setting we have given them a lot of responsibility this year and have created groups of delegates for them to advise. Through the advisors, students are able to receive feedback on their work that is really helpful."

How was your experience as the organizer of the Family Game Night?




Getting Rid of Standardized Testing

Tick. Tick. Tick. The clock to your right emits a soft clicking sound throughout the deafening silence. You stare at your computer only to realize the question you are supposed to answer is impossible to solve, at least to you. The question stands out on the monochrome screen, radiating stress and anxiety.

This is what happens to kids and teens in grades as low as 1st grade to as high as college. The monstrosity known as standardized testing looms over students, and it can cause a lot of unnecessary tension. If you are a student, you can probably relate to the very common scenario above. Standardized testing can leave students feeling bad about themselves after they see their grades or compare them to their peers. In my opinion, mandatory testing is an extremely unnecessary part of school that stresses out students, eats up valuable learning time, and is a poor testing of a student's knowledge.



Think about it like this (this example is from a Ted-Ed video which I will link in the resources section): standardized tests are like rulers, their usefulness depends on the criteria and design, and they're literally just a tool. For example, you couldn't measure the temperature or rainfall with a ruler, could you? And you obviously can't measure how loud someone is talking with a ruler. It's design just doesn't work that way. If you tried to measure an orange's circumference with a ruler, it would measure the length, but it isn't flexible enough to measure the whole circumference of it. The ruler hasn't been manufactured with the flexibility needed to complete said task. Hence, if standardized tests are "given the wrong job" or aren't "designed" properly, they might end up "measuring" the wrong thing.

For example, if you gave a student with dyslexia/reading challenges a word problem (math) they might have a hard time READING the problem. In this case, it wouldn't reflect the student's mathematical ability, rather the student's reading ability. Or, another example would be if a problem included a pop culture reference or an unfamiliar word, the student wouldn't fully understand the problem, and may get it wrong purely because they didn't understand a word. Say one problem was "Divide the number of hares in the word problem by the number of arachnids". If the word problem used the words "rabbits" and "spiders" instead of "hares" and "arachnids", then the student facing the problem might not be able to connect the two examples.

Teachers also feel pressured to prepare students for standardized tests, and a lot of useful class time can be forfeited to study for a test. This time could have been spent learning a new topic, having (educational) fun, or spending time with other students. Aside from the students, teachers feel guilty if their students don't score well, because in some cases, test scores reflect how a teacher presents material to a classroom. In theory, if students don't perform well on a test, their teacher is to blame for not teaching it well. This isn't a fair method, and teachers shouldn't be blamed for something that could be a result of multiple different factors. Burdening student AND teachers for the cost of data isn't right.

Moreover, standardized tests only show which students are good at taking tests. When you think about it, intelligence cannot be judged from questions that are not suited to someone's needs. People are smart in their own ways, not necessarily academically. If students don't get the score they wanted on a test or quiz, it may lead to problems later in life like depression, anxiety, and constant insecurity. Standardized tests seem to only judge academic value, and they don't judge equally valuable traits like kindness, creativity, leadership skills, and work ethic. At this rate, the only skill students will learn is how to take tests, and they will have a hard time when they get older. As Albert Einstein said, "Everybody is a genius. But if you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will live its whole life believing that it is stupid." Sure, tests may be a way to collect a large amount of "averaged" data, but students aren't just numbers on a list. If you try to make a test with the same questions for everyone you're ignoring the fact that everybody is different, and has different needs, as stated before.

In conclusion, standardized testing is not an useful way to measure intelligence or capability in students, and it shouldn't be given anymore!

A Forest Under Ice?

When the idea of Antarctica is mentioned, it is thought of as a cold, and unpopulated place. It has snowy and harsh conditions, making it difficult for human life to become successful in the area. This is true, though it hasn't always been this way. A group of researchers discovered that Antarctica was once a swampy rainforest approximately 9 million years ago. Being in the cretaceous time period, the forest was the home to a countless number of human-eating reptiles, which are known as dinosaurs. The discovery of the rainforest began when some remains were found under the ice in a sediment core near Pine Island Glacier

located in West Antarctica in 2017.



When scientists first discovered the site, they learned that the temperatures in the rainforest during the cretaceous period were much warmer than those today. Using the soil, they estimated that there were average annual temperatures of about 53-55 degrees Fahrenheit and about 68-77 degrees Fahrenheit during the summer months. Being only 560 miles (900 km) away from the south pole, this place is expected to be much cooler, with negative temperatures. Today, the same site has an annual temperature of -40 degrees Fahrenheit (-40 Celcius). This was a confusing find, as that part of the Earth didn't have sunlight for ½ of the year. However, scientists did come up with a theory. They predicted that there must have been more carbon dioxide in the air than there is in modern times.

Scientists didn't just make discoveries on the ground. They made some underground as well. With some more investigation underground, scientists discovered remains of pollen and spores spanning about 65 types of plants. The soil they found it in, was about 90 feet beneath the seafloor under ocean depths of 3,300 feet (1,000 meters). This helped scientists learn about the plant life at the time, and how many living things died at that spot to make it so many layers deep before finding the plants. This led to new theories and discoveries. The Earth is a beautiful place, with many different weather conditions, terrains, and people. However, it has changed significantly, and will never stop changing. The Earth will continue to change, and it will never be the same as it is today.

The Fight For America's 51 st State

Introduction

On June 26th, 2020, the United States House of Representatives voted to do something they have never done before. It passed a bill to create the 51_{st} state, approving the statehood of D.C. by the U.S. House for the first time in history!



Why D.C. Wants To Be A State?

Other territories such as Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands are represented by "delegates" who can't vote. Americans in these territories don't pay federal taxes. However, D.C. residents pay federal taxes though they are a territory, but don't get full representation in congress. In fact, in D.C., the average D.C. person pays more in federal taxes than in any state.

Many D.C. residents are against the fact that they don't have statehood but, still have to pay a large amount of taxes to the government. In the United States Constitution, however, the federal government is not supposed to be based in a state, but should be based in a neutral federal district, what today is called Washington D.C.

D.C.'s road to statehood

Since the creation of the country, the district has grown into a major city in the United States. Since the 1960s, D.C. has had some laws that brought it closer and closer to statehood. For instance, in the 1960s, congress granted the District of Columbia electoral college votes for the presidential election. In 1971, congress granted a nonvoting congress member. The present nonvoting congress member for D.C. is Eleanor Holmes Norton. Finally, D.C got the right to elect its own local government in 1973. Congress still completely controls D.C.'s budget, which often undermines D.C's local government which is another prominent reason D.C. wants statehood. According to vox, "In March [2020], as millions lost their jobs, congress passed coronavirus relief bill, giving each state at least a billion dollars. But the District of Columbia...was instead treated as a US territory and got less than half that."

What's Stopping D.C's Statehood?

As D.C. is supposed to be located in a federal district, Eleanor Holmes Norton, the representative of D.C., has made a plan for a new state. A federal district would still be around the actual government buildings. However, the remaining 66 square miles of Washington D.C. will be the newest and smallest state called the Douglass Commonwealth. But, what is stopping D.C's statehood? Politics is the answer. You see, in the 2016 election, the Republican Party got only 4% of the votes casted in District of Columbia, making it Democratic.

If the Douglass Commonwealth becomes a state, it shall most likely give the democratic party one more vote in the House of Representative, and possibly two more votes in the Senate. This is the main obstacle for D.C. to reach statehood. Therefore, Republicans are against the statehood of D.C.

What has kept a balance between the different political parties?

After the 13 Colonies were founded, there were no problems in adding states to the country until the year of 1818; when Missouri wanted to be a state. At the time, there are 11 Free States and 11 Slave States, which was a balance between the different political parties. If Missouri joined the slave states, it would create an imbalance between the free states and slave states. Therefore, both parties agreed that they would add Missouri, a slave state, at the same time they added Maine, a free state. After that, states were mostly added in pairs. For example, in 1846, they added Florida, a slave state, with Iowa, a free state. Most recently, in 1959, the United States added Hawaii, which leaned republican at the time, and Alaska, which leaned democratic at the time. But, adding only Washington D.C. might create an imbalance to the political side of the government, but the people of America want it.

The 1.9 Trillion Stimulus: Biden's Proposal

On Thursday, March 11th, 2021, US President Joe Biden signed one of the largest stimulus deals in United States history into law. The goal of this massive bill, one of Biden's foremost campaign promises, was to give aid to Americans struggling due to the COVID-19 pandemic. First unveiled by Biden in early January, it was sold as a way to boost the economy and give needed aid to Americans that were going through tough times during the pandemic. It was not, in fact, the first of this type of stimulus passed; on March 27, 2020, the Trump administration passed CARES Act (Coronavirus, Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act), a \$2.2 trillion economic stimulus package also designated for COVID relief. In the December of 2020, another \$900 billion bill was passed, reduced from its original draft to gain bipartisan support.

This stimulus bill, called the American Rescue Plan, was controversial when first proposed; supported by the Democrats and vehemently opposed by the Republicans, passing Congress by a hair's breadth, solely relying on the Democrats' House and Senate majority, with not a single Republican in either chamber supporting it. The reasons for this are complicated; the relief package was seen by some as much too expensive and including unnecessary partisan amendments. In early February, a group of 10 Republicans met with Biden in the White House to propose a much less expensive, \$618 billion, package as a counteroffer to Biden's bill. However, discussions between the president and senators ended with no real progress made.

On the more controversial end of the American Rescue Plan were the amendments that the GOP hailed as partisan and completely irrelevant to coronavirus relief. These provisions included raising the federal minimum wage to \$15 per hour, which Republican congressional leaders thought would put too much of a strain on small businesses and lead to the loss of jobs. This amendment was later removed from the bill by the Senate, as per a decision made by the Senate parliamentarian, Elizabeth MacDonough. Another contentious part of the bill was a provision to send \$350 billion to state and local governments, which was seen by some Republicans as part of a "liberal wish list", with unnecessary aid that would be biased toward blue states. Other disputed provisions include \$130 billion for school, which GOP senators have countered with \$50 billion, \$1400 stimulus checks for those making up to a certain yearly income, increased child tax credits (raising them from \$2000 per child to \$36000 per child up to the age of 6, and \$300 for children up to 17) and increased employment benefits, raising insurance from \$300 to \$400 a week, the latter three of which Republican senators have derided as much too expensive and overly excessive.

Despite these strong oppositions, the bill did pass in March, with 76% of voters supporting the relief package, according to a poll conducted by the Morning Consult and Politico. 68% of Americans support the \$1400 direction payments in the package while 53% of Americans back the \$15 federal minimum wage raise, according to a poll done by USA Today. While the bill is popular among a majority of the population, President Biden and Vice President Harris have begun to travel around the country to attempt to sell the bill to those who oppose it. The White House dubbed it the "Help is Here" tour, where, along with the President and VP, the First Lady and Second Gentleman, would tour the nation, with the goal of promoting their bill, along with vaccine rollout, to small businesses and the general public.



It is important to remember, that while it was designed to aid Americans in need, and while it cost an almost mind-boggling amount, one of the main goals of this stimulus bill was to help jump-start the American economy, which had been severely affected by the pandemic in the past year. After the government stimulus bill was passed, along with the US's fast-passed vaccine rollout, the OECD (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development) nearly doubled the US's predicted economic growth percentage for 2021 from December, jumping from 3.2% to 6.5%. The reason this is so crucial is because America, being the world's largest economy, has a significant effect on the world economy. Due to the bill, the OECD increased the economic growth forecast for the global economy as well, raising it from 4.2% to 5.6% for 2021. Overall, at least recently, the passage of the stimulus bill has seemed to have a positive effect on the US, and the world at large, but it remains to be seen whether this economic boost is temporary, or whether it will continue into the next year, helping boost the economy up from pre-COVID levels.

Holi: The Festival of Colors

Top Ten Rarest Flowers in the World

We see flowers everywhere, everyday, but there are some flowers in the world that are so rare, the chance to see them is once in a lifetime. Here are the top ten rarest flowers in the world to this day.

10. Kadupul flower

Blooming only at midnight on full moons and dying before dawn, the Kadupul flower deserves a spot as one of the flowers in the world. Because of their nighttime blooming nature, this flower is difficult to find. Not only does the kadupul flower have beautiful features, it smells pleasant as well. Until recently, no botanist was able to correctly give an explanation for the flower's mysterious death in the morning.

9. Gibraltar Campion

Once only found in Gibraltar, the

campion flower was declared extinct in 1992. However, in 1994, a single specimen was found by a hiker climbing the high cliffs of the area. Now, the gibraltar campion flower is only grown in the Almeda Gibraltar Botanic Gardens and the Royal Botanic Gardens of London.

Even though the flower may have a weak fragrance, its beauty is the complete opposite.

8. Ghost Orchid

This rare spider web-like flower only grows in Cuba and Florida. The demands for a successful cultivation is what makes this flower so rare. Along with its rarity, the flower has a unique quality: It has no leaves. Also, because both the stem and flower itself is green, it is difficult to spot the ghost orchid. Due to its lack of leaves, the ghost orchid grows on another plant to get enough energy night.to survive. When it blooms (April-August), the flower produces a soap-like odor.

6. Parrot's Beak

Endemic to the Canary Islands, parrot's beak is definitely one of the most beautiful flowers in the world. Its physical appearance is what gives the flower its name. Blooming in the spring and needing only cool temperatures, inconsistent temperatures can cause the death of this flower. Unfortunately, the parrot's beak is disappearing, and the ones that are left on the Canary Islands are protected by law.

4. Yellow and Purple Ladies' Slippers

Rare members of the orchid families, this flower mainly lives in London. Having a combination of *both* yellow and purple hues rarest in this flower is rare. When that does occur, almost ¾ of the ladies' slipper is yellow, while the remaining part is purple. When the flower blooms (from around late spring to early summer), no noticeable aroma is produced. Being one of the most expensive flowers in the world, the yellow and purple ladies' slippers is protected by law in London.

7. Chocolate Cosmos

Native to Mexico, this rare, but beautiful flower is named after its chocolate-like after blooming - in the evening at the summer. Sadly, the chocolate cosmos flower is extinct in the wild. Reproduced by the vegetation propagation in 1902, only the clone of the original flower exists today. Now, the places where the chocolate cosmos habites is protected by aw.

5. Youtan Poluo

Rumored to bloom once every 3000 years, the youtan poluo flower is undoubtedly one of the most interesting flowers on the planet. At first glance, this flower does not look like a flower. It is very tiny and produces a sandalwood-like odor.

Discovered by a Chinese farmer, the youtan poluo is found to live in China, Taiwan, Korea, and even the US (although this is rare). Nowadays, there are many studies conducted to solve the mystery of this fascinating flower's bloom.

3. Corpse Flower

Only found in the forests of Indonesia, the corpse flower is the largest and smelliest flower in the world. When it blooms (which is about once every 30-40 years), the flower produces a rotten meat-like odor. The outer part of this flower is green with the inside being red. And the leaf of the corpse flower can grow up to 20 feet in length! Because it so rare, the botanical gardens in Sumatra where this flower grows are protected by law.

2. Jade Vine

The jade vine is a rare flower in the bean and pea family. Endemic to the forests of the Philippines, this flower has claw-shaped petals that can grow up to 3 meters (~10 feet) in size. The jade vine's beautiful hues can vary from blue to light green. If it gets pollinated by bats, this flower can glow at Its constantly changing environmental conditions and natural pollinators is what makes this flower so rare.



This incredibly attractive flower with deep pink shades takes the spot as the rarest odor flower in the world. Discovered in China end of and brought back to the UK in 1804 by John Middlemist, there are only 2 known locations of this flower to this day - one in New Zealand and the other in the UK.After the middlemist red got brought to Europe, the ones in China got wiped out. Thankfully, more were able to get cultivated back in the UK. Currently, there is research being conducted by botanists to find a plant species that is related to the middlemist red.





Myanmar's Military History and Current Events

In 1948, Myanmar gained independence from British Colonial Rule. Initially after its independence, inspired by India, Burma began as a parliamentary democracy. However, in 1962, a military coup led by General U Ne Win overpowered the parliamentary democracy, and held Myanmar with an iron fist for decades. During which, a new constitution was formed, encouraging Burma's isolation from other nations, and affirming the military's power and influence. Isolating Burma from other countries toppled the economy and established a black market.

The rapid fall of the economy, paired with corruption, food insecurity, and more led to the first display of historical protests against the military government. There were massive student-led protests, but in August, 1988 the army took action against these protests, resulting in 3,000+ deaths and displacing thousands of citizens. Several years past, and in 2007 came the Saffron Revolution. Initial anger over the steep increase in fuel prices, became widespread protests against the military government, often led by monks wearing saffron robes.

In 2011, President Thein Sein began easing the iron grip by releasing political prisoners, encouraging foreign investment, and introducing economic policies. Four years later, Myanmar held its first nationwide and "fairest election," in which the National League of Democracy (NLD) won. The Nobel Peace Prize winning activist and leader of the NLD, Suu Kyi became the State Counsellor and her close confidant, Htin Kyaw became the head of state.

Nevertheless, the constitution assured that the military held power as "25 percent of parliament's seats are reserved for the military, and any changes to the constitution need[s] approval from more than 75 percent of parliament, effectively giving the military veto power over any amendment," according to cfr.org. In 2020, Myanmar held its second election during which the NLD 396 of 476 seats, and the military's proxy party only won 33 seats. The military claimed voter fraud, which once rejected, led them to stage a coup under the claims that Senior General Min Aung Hlaing will lead Myanmar for 'one year of emergency.'

As this article is being written (March 4th, 2021), Suu Kyi has been detained by the military, who have placed house arrest on several NLD officials and lawyers. Such actions and the coup in general has ignited protests throughout the nation. As of February 22nd, 2021, barricades, fleets of vehicles have been placed in "strategic urban locations," according to the NY Times, to prevent protests. Additionally, messages such as "Protesters are now inciting people, especially emotional teenagers and youth, toward a path of confrontation where they will suffer a loss of life," are being employed to possibly discourage protesters. Additionally, as of March 3rd, 50 civilian protesters have been killed. Yet, citizens of Myanmar, old or young, regardless of occupations have joined hands to protest against the military coup.

Why the EV SUV Revolution has not arrived just yet

Ah, Electric Vehicles... the darling of cars that are vying to save our beautiful planet...

Cars are something that mostly everyone has. Right now, the kind of cars that everyone is buying is Sport Utility Vehicles, commonly known as SUVs. These are the kind of vehicles people would buy if they want a lot of space in their car, with great capabilities. Many people are also buying EVs because of the benefits that come with it, both environmentally and financially.

But what if there is that one person who wants both an EV and an SUV? Well, simple, you get an electric SUV, right? Well, it's not as easy as you might think. Right now, there are about 6 electric SUVs that people would actually want to buy. Out of those 6, only 3 of them are affordable, and 4 of them are not extravagant. Ahem, Pigeon-Winged Minivan!

Out of the 3 affordable SUVs, they are all great. The only issue is, even though they are affordable, they are the expensive kind of affordable. They are all controversial in their own right. For example, you have an electric SUV with the Mustang nameplate. You also have an SUV that when the doors are open, looks like a pigeon-looking blob thing.

The question I would like to answer today is, How come there is no electric SUV revolution, since there is the electric car revolution, and the SUV revolution.

1. Range

If you are looking for an electric car, driving range is one of the most important factors. If you look at the affordable electric SUVs, they all have quite low ranges. The Standard Range Tesla Model Y SUV can go up to 244 miles on a charge.

Notice how I said "UP TO" 244 miles on a charge. Every single time, there are factors affecting that number, such as weather, drag, and speed. That will always lower the range of any vehicle, not just electric.

The low ranges are not attracting much interest from buyers. Some EV SUVs, however, have really high ranges, though, such as the Long Range Tesla Model Y SUV, which can go up to 326 miles on a charge. However, all of that extra range comes at a price.



2. Price

Speaking of price, like I mentioned earlier, these cars are the expensive kind of affordable. I'm gonna use the Model Y again as an example. After ditching the Standard Range version, the Model Y now is more expensive, starting at \$48,000 for the Long Range model. That price can easily reach more than \$50,000 with just adding a color that is not white.

KA-CHING!\$\$\$\$\$\$

In general, electric vehicles are expensive due to the cost of battery production. And, SUVs, being big, will cost more if you want more space.

The price of every EV SUV is more than the average price of a car in the USA, which is \$36,757. These high prices are not attractive for anyone who either has a low budget or just can't afford it.

3. Utility And Space

Electric cars being electric cars, they have batteries. And batteries are under the floor. Batteries are thick, which means that the height of the floor is higher than the floor of a normal gasoline powered car. That means that the legroom of a vehicle will be less, because your legs will be higher. Because your legs will be higher, you will be higher, which means that headroom will also be affected as well. That is one of the major downsides.

Also, there are electric motors that are needed in order to put down the power and move the wheels. And all of these electric SUVs have a dual motor all wheel drive powertrain, which means that there is one electric motor on the front axle, and one electric motor on the rear axle. Normally, the rear motor would be bigger than the front motor. Because the rear motor is big, it makes the floor of the rear cargo area higher, which, in turn, reduces cargo space by a teensy bit. That makes these SUVs very unattractive for consumers to consider as a possible purchase.

However, it is worth noting that because there is no engine, there is a cargo area under the hood, instead of an engine. So, even if the cargo area was low in the back, you get all of that extra space plus more up front.

Overall, electric SUVs are practically a pointless luxury. They don't have all of the utility that people expect from SUVs, and they definitely do not have the efficiency. If you want a long range electric SUV, it is highly suggested to get one if you have the money. But, if you don't have that kind of money, and you want an EV, get something like an electric sedan, like a Tesla Model 3, or an electric hatchback, like a Nissan Leaf.

One thing to point out: these are not as bad as the rich people SUVs, which get like 9 miles to the gallon. These are the main reasons as to why not many people are buying electric SUVs.

How TO and How NOT to Save Time

At least once in our lives we have wanted to save or control a little bit of time. You won't be able to control time, but there is a way to save some. Daylight Saving Time (DST) is the yearly practice of setting clocks forward one hour between the months of March and November. The idea behind DST is to conserve, or "save" natural light, since spring, summer, and early fall days typically get dark later in the evening compared to late fall and winter days. The non-DST period between November and March is known as Standard Time. This is how most Americans and

Europeans "save" and "lose" an hour of their day.

What is DST?

The United States has officially observed DST since 1918. We set our clocks forward one hour at 2 a.m. on the second Sunday in March, resulting in one less hour of sleep that night.



Then, at 2 a.m. on the first Sunday in November, we set our clocks back one hour, resulting in one more hour of sleep than night. DST is often referred to as "Spring Forward, Fall Backward" because of when these time changes occur. Adjusting the time by one hour may not seem like too drastic a change, but sleep experts have noted troubling trends that occur during the transition between DST and Standard Time. These include a rise in heart problems, mood disorders, and motor vehicle collisions. Furthermore, DST can cause sleep problems if daily rhythms are not aligned with natural cycles of light and darkness. Some people also experience insomnia symptoms due to time changes.

The History of Time

Benjamin Franklin is the one to take the honor or the blame, depending on your view of the time changes, for coming up with the idea to reset clocks in the summer months as a way to conserve energy. By moving clocks forward, people could take advantage of the extra evening daylight rather than wasting energy on lights. DST didn't officially begin until more than a century later. Germany established DST in May 1916 as a way to conserve fuel during World War I. The rest of Europe came onboard shortly thereafter. And in 1918, the United States adopted daylight saving time.

Why do we still have daylight saving time?

Fewer than 40% of the world's countries observe daylight saving time, according to timeanddate.com. However, the countries who do observe DST take advantage of the natural daylight in the summer evenings. That's because the days start to get longer as Earth moves from the winter season to spring and summer, with the longest day of the year on the summer solstice (June 20th, 2021).

During the summer season in each hemisphere, Earth, which revolves around its axis at an angle, is tilted directly toward the sun. Regions farthest away from the equator and closer to the poles get the most benefit from the DST clock change, because there is a more dramatic change in sunlight throughout the seasons.

Research has also suggested that with more daylight in the evenings, there are fewer traffic accidents, as there are fewer cars on the road when it's dark outside. More daylight also could mean more outdoor exercise, more fun with friends, or longer outdoor activities.

The leading reason for daylight saving time has long been to save energy. However, Stanton Hadley, a senior researcher at Oak Ridge National Laboratory, says the energy question probably isn't the real reason the United States sticks with daylight saving time. Energy might be the leading reason of the people, but it isn't the real reason. Hadley says, "In the vast scheme of things, the energy saving is not the big driver. It's people wanting to take advantage of that light time in the evening." That is true. People want to make most of their day and with more light outside, they have "more time" to accomplish different tasks.

Daylight Saving Time Sleep Tips

In the days and weeks leading up to time changes, you can prepare yourself for the adjustment by taking the following precautions:

- **Practice Good Sleep Hygiene:** Sleep hygiene refers to practices that can influence sleep for better or worse. In order to ease the transition of the time change, you should avoid caffeine up to four hours before bedtime. Also, refrain from consuming heavy dinners and snacks before bedtime. It can also negatively affect how well you sleep that night.
- **Establish a Consistent Sleep Routine:** Going to bed and waking up at the same time each day including the weekends is a healthy sleep hygiene practice that can also prepare you for time changes. Make sure you get at least seven hours of sleep each night before and after transitioning to or from DST.
- **Gradually Alter Your Bedtime:** Two to three days before the transition between Standard Time and DST in early March, sleep experts recommend waking up 15-20 minutes earlier than usual. Then, on the Saturday before the time change, set your alarm clock back by an additional 15-20 minutes. Adjusting your wake-up time can help the body make a smoother transition when the time change occurs.

No matter if you follow daylight saving time or not, this method millions of people have been following for the past century can be proven to be useful or a waste of time. No pun intended! Maybe sometime in the future, there will be a change, or a better, more practical method of saving time and energy. All we have to do is wait for time to tell.

"Touchdown!"

"Touchdown!". The one word that provides excitement to everyone in the world. That same excitement happened on February 18th, 2021. On this day, a new, intelligent rover called Perseverance successfully landed at 8:55 UTC on the red planet, Mars. But, there are many questions circling around the rover about what its mission is, when it was launched, why it was launched, etc. In this article I will answer many of these questions.

The Reason For Perseverance:

Launched on July 30th, 2020, NASA scientists in JPL have sent Perseverance to Mars to find signs of life, to collect samples, and provide more information about Mars to help with future human expeditions there. You might be questioning yourself thinking "Shruthi, no life form can live on Mars, though," and your absolutely correct no life form exists on Mars now. However there could have been life before on Mars for NASA scientists have found a dried up lake, Jezero Crater, which Perseverance will explore. Life on Earth only started because of water. Water is very essential for all living things to exist, so scientists in NASA believe that if there was water on Mars, life could have been existing on Mars. Using its in-built drill, Perseverance will gather good rock and soil samples. It will then put them in a "cache" on the surface of the red planet. Finally this intelligent rover will be running several tests, observations, and all together gathering knowledge on Mars. One of these tests is a method in making oxygen from Mars' atmosphere! These tests will help scientists on Earth understand better how they can get humans to Mars! By studying past microbial life, doing several tests, drilling, making observations, and by gathering info, Perseverance is going to help scientists conclude whether humans can live on Mars!

Ingenuity:

Like past rovers launched on Mars, Perseverance is very expensive. Perseverance is the most expensive rover launched to Mars by NASA and costs \$2.7 billion! A helicopter experiment (drone) is traveling with Perseverance. It's called Ingenuity. Ingenuity's mission is to demonstrate the first powered flight tests on Mars. However it will be nestled under Perserverance's belly to help protect itself from debris. After about 30 days, it will then demonstrate the first powered flight tests on Mars. Since Mars' atmosphere is 99% less dense than Earth's atmosphere, it will be difficult for Ingenuity to fly correctly. For this reason the drone is very lightweight weighing 4 pounds and standing at 19 inches tall. To make sure the flight is successful, NASA scientists in JPL have equipped the drone with four large carbon-fiber blades constructed into 2 rotors. From one end to the other, the rotors span 4 ft. When flying, the rotors will fly opposite directions at a speed of about 2,400 rpm, which is a bit faster than your average helicopters on Earth. Jezero Crater gets exceedingly cold during the night to temperatures under negative 100 degrees Fahrenheit. Because of this reason, Ingenuity will be using more of its energy to keep itself warm instead of using it for flying. During the drone's flight JPL won't be able to control it's flying.

Also, because of communication delays, the commands for Ingenuity's flights will be sent to the drone before the actual flights. Besides Perseverance carrying Ingenuity, this rover has 24 cameras however Ingenuity has only 2. The cameras' on Perseverance will help NASA explore Mars and will also film Ingenuity's flights. The cameras' on the drone itself will also be filming the flights to give JPL a better view of flights on Mars!

To sum up, Perseverance and Ingenuity are going to accomplish a lot of great things on Mars to help with future human expeditions. This is all thanks to the amazing people in Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL)!

Amazing Facts About Perseverance & Ingenuity:

- Roboticist, Jaakko Karras from NASA built the helicopter drone experiment, Ingenuity
- Perseverance is a car size and is 9 ft 6 inches tall
- Perseverance has a microphone to record sounds on Mars
- Rover is carrying pieces of astronaut space suits
- NASA wants to learn if humans can survive on Mars from the radiation that Mars gets
- Perseverance is going to test whether the material of the space suits is protective enough for humans
- By doing this, scientists will be able to learn whether the current space suits will be able to protect humans from radiation
- Sleep is very important to everyone, even for Mars rovers! Perseverance can put itself to sleep!
- If conditions become unstable on Mars, this Mars rover can go into "safe mode"
- When this happens, Perseverance cuts all communications to NASA scientists
- The Mars rovers' name was chosen by a seventh grader, Alexander Mather in a national contest held by NASA to choose a name for the Mars rover
- Perseverance's destination, Jezero Crater is a 500 meter deep crater
- Jezero Crater used to be a lake which dried out about 3.5 to 3.8 billion years ago!
- Takes about 7 months to get to Mars from Earth
- Since Coronavirus was discovered around the same time Perseverance was built and tested, about 90% of the team working on Perseverance worked from home.
- Perseverance is the only Mars rover to have a final prep with a virtual team!
- Vaneeza Rupani selected the name Ingenuity for the Mars Rover, Perseverance, however
 NASA scientists used the name Ingenuity for the drone helicopter experiment!

April Showers

March winds and April showers bring forth May flowers.' Most of us are familiar with the term, but how can April have so many showers? April does have more showers than other months, regardless of where you are in the country.

Why do we have April showers? April is a month in transition; the long, cold winter days start to wane, and the jet stream a band of strong winds begins to move northwards. The chilliness of the dark months is replaced with warmth and light, so too low pressure and, as a result, the skies open. But there is more to our April showers than just low pressure. At this time of year, the temperature of the sea is at its lowest. Lengthening days and warming weather result in a significant increase in daytime heating. And it is this disparity between the warm land and cold sea that causes shower clouds to form.

The truth is the saying has more to do with proverbs than weather patterns. To understand the saying from a weather perspective, it helps to remember that there is a difference between "rain" and "rain showers." Rain is technically the result of a weather front or the boundary shared by two bodies of air. These fronts can span hundreds of miles and consist of many types of clouds. The clouds create precipitation that can fall for days over large areas of land. The result: a lot of rain and sometimes flooding.

Rain showers are different.

During the month of April, a band of strong winds, known as the jet stream, moves northwards. This changes the air pressure and leads to an explosion of cumulus clouds — the type of clouds that create rain showers. In coastal areas, the sea also contributes to forming April showers. As the days also get progressively warmer during the month, the sea's lower temperature can clash with increased surface temperature to cause rain showers. Also, the precipitation from these clouds rarely lasts longer than a few hours.

April rain showers also have less impact on certain types of flowers. In general, perennials are the flowers we imagine when we talk about the visible signs of spring. Since the bulbs of perennials have been in the ground all winter long, their growth and health depends on the overall trend of rainfall over the course of many months.

And during the blooming season, too much rainfall can actually ruin the flowering blossoms because of disease. Annuals are completely different. They need rain to blossom, but it needs to be rainfall after the plants are in the ground. So the likelihood of April showers leading to May flowers on an annual plant is less likely unless you planted them in a warm climate.

So the month of April, traditionally a rainy period, gives way to May, when flowers will bloom because of the water provided to them by the April rains. April showers can bring enjoyable things indeed, abundance of flowers in May.

The Hidden Factory!

The Liver plays a big role in our body, it is one of those body parts that we cannot live without! There is a big factory that is working inside the human body! This factory runs for 24/7 it is an organ that is called a Liver. This organ acts as a "Storehouse, Manufacturing Hub, and a Processing Plant." Each individual task includes so many important subtasks that without the Liver our body would completely shut down.

One of the main tasks of the Liver is to filter the blood from 2 main sources, The Hepatic Artery, and the Hepatic Portal Vein. The Hepatic Artery is a tube that delivers blood from the heart, while the Hepatic Portal Vein delivers blood from the interstices. The blood fills up the Liver with nutricients, and stores the nutrients in the Lobule.

The Lobule sends oxygen to the Liver to help it function. The blood that the Liver receives from the intestines are fats, carbohydrates, vitamins, and other nutrients that are dissolved in it.

These are processed in various ways, if it is carbohydrates it is processed into sugars that the body uses as energy. If the body doesn't use some of the nutrients it stores them for later when the body might want to use them. The blood isn't only full of nutrients it also has toxins. The liver converts it into something that doesn't harm the body or isolates it away, channeling it to the kidneys and intestines to be excreted or separated. For example, Blood Plasma proteins, including fatty acids, help form blood clotting which are made into cholesterol, helps the body with vitamin d, and substances that help digestion.

Moving on, one of the important products in the Liver is Bile. Bile is a liquid that helps digestion, it helps break down fats, destroy microbes, and neutralize extra stomach acid. The Liver stores the Bile in a small tank under the Liver called the Gallbladder. Bile also helps take the toxins from the Liver out of the body.

Now that we understand what the liver is and its functions, how can we keep it healthy, and what habits/foods damage it? The 2 main habits that not only affect your Liver but your body is Smoking and Alcohol. It is the cheapest type of paint to set yourself up with.



Oil Paint


4. Hoboken

The Life of Thurgood Marshall: A hero

One hundred thirteen years ago, on the second of July, a new person had emerged. He spent his childhood trying to survive against the harsh laws that kept black and white separate. Throughout his life, he had fought as a talented lawyer and joined in the civil rights movement. He was known for his heroism and one of the key people to help to equal all people in this country. His name was Thurgood Marshall. A person who put others before himself.



Thoroughgood (Thurgood) Marshall was born on July 2, 1908. As a child, young Thurgood faced many challenges in racism. He had to go to a school for all blacks and was kept separate from the school where people who had light skin could attend. As a child, Thurgood was mostly known as Thoroughgood Marshall, which was his birth name. In the second grade, he changed his name to Thurgood because he was tired of writing over and over again.

Thurgood's mother Norma Alica Williams always encouraged Thurgood and his brother to do well in school. She thought education was important for the boys. She always told them to think before you act and make good decisions. His family lived in a normal middle-class house and were able to pay for his education. He was very mischievous and often used to get sent out of class to read the constitution. That probably explains how he got into the world of law in his future.

As Thurgood finished his schooling in 1925, he attended Lincoln University in Oxford, Pennsylvania where his brother had attended as well. During this period of time, Thurgood decided to focus more on his social life in college. Since he was intelligent, he got in with tiny effort. After getting suspended for hazing, Thurgood focused more on his academics. He joined the debate club which would help greatly later on in his life and developed his passion to become a lawyer. This was one of the first moments in Thurgood's life where he got involved in the civil rights movement by helping to stop segregation in a movie theater. He described this as one of the happiest moments of his life later on. Thurgood shortly met his future wife, Vivan Burey and they married on September 4, 1929. Atlast, in 1930, Thurgood graduated from college.

Not so long after the start of his young adulthood, Marshall had gone to attend the University of Maryland Law School. This was one of the many important times in his lifetime where he faced the same problem just like others with the same skin color as him: Racism. The university of Maryland had only accepted white students. Because of this rule, Thurgood was rejected and was forced to look on for another university to attend to. Thurgood was ultimately accepted into Howard University where he learned about civil rights law and took his passion to becoming a lawyer even more seriously. He took the constitution as his friend, studying it, and embracing it. In 1933, Thurgood graduated from Howard University, ranking first in his class.

After passing the bar exam, Thurgood opened a small law practice in Baltimore. He then volunteered for the NAACP (National Association for the Advancement of Colored People). Now it was time for one of the earliest and important cases. As known before, the University of Maryland Law School does not allow colored people to attend. That's how Thurgood was rejected previously when he tried to attend. He held a trial during court and sooner or later, Thurgood had won the case against the University. From then on colored people could attend the University and there were no rules that kept them from passing through.

In 1935, one of Thurgood's mentors from NAACP appointed him as Assistant Special Counsel for New York. In 1938, Thurgood took over as Special Counsel. He traveled to numerous places in the south to make votes fair and fair trials for African-Americans. In 1940, the NAACP set up an organization known as fund inc. Thurgood worked to desegregate schools and other education platforms. 1952 was the year where Thurgood got his wish. That year, his famous case *Brown vs. The Board of Education* took place. The case was argued a couple of years later as Thurgood fought to desegregate public schools. After many months of arguing the Supreme court had sided with Thurgood. Now, segregation in most public schools was banned. In 1961, president John F. Kennedy appointed Thurgood as the federal judge of the Court of Appeals in New York City. Thurgood spent the next four years of his life working in court to make sure that everyone would be treated equally across the country. None of his opinions about the cases reversed on the Supreme Court. In 1965, president Lyndon B. Johnson selected Thurgood to be Solicitor General of the country. He represented the role for a short period of time. Two years later in 1967, president Johnson appointed him to be the first ever African-American in history to an Associate Justice in the U.S. Supreme Court.

Thurgood spent most of the later part of his life working in the Supreme Court. He had won twenty-nine of the thirty-two civil rights cases alone before being appointed to the Supreme Court. Throughout the time he spent while working in the Supreme Court, Thurgood upholded individual rights, expanded civil rights, and much more. In the case *Furman vs Georgia*, Thurgood argued that death penalty was unconstitutional just because of the wat your look or the color of your skin. Additionally, he made contributions to labor law, securities law, and tax law. Thurgood continued to argue for the freedom of colored people and make them equal to non-colored people until 1991, when he retired from the Supreme Court. Sadly, two years later on January 24, 1993, at two in the afternoon, Thurgood had died from heart failure in Bethesda, Maryland.

Throughout his life, Thurgood Marshall did nothing but argue, argue for the freedom for all people through winning cases, fighting in the civil rights movement, and much more. Back then, during the civil rights movement, there were a lot of great heroes that have helped to ensure the freedom of colored people. Thurgood Marshall is one of the important members of the group. He had devoted his life to make sure that people can live a comfortable life in the next generation. He wanted the future a place to be where no one accused one because of the color of their skin or the background they came from. Thurgood fought for us so we could live a better life today. People like that aren't easy to find. Thurgood Marshall showed us how humanity can be the best versions of themselves. Thurgood Marshall will always remain a hero to us and will always be remembered in the history books.

Cherry blossoms are a part of Japan since the early days, even though they originated from China. During the Nara period of Japan from 710-794, a tradition appeared called "hanami", which involved drinking under a cherry blossom, or *sakura*. This tradition was meant for the elite to relax under a beautiful blooming cherry blossom, but as time went on, this tradition spread to the samurai, and then the common citizens. During festivities that involved a lot of partying, people would eat and drink under these trees.

The love for cherry blossoms only continued as time went on, considering they symbolized growth and were associated with life. They were planted everywhere: from the Emperor's palace to the Buddist temples. A group in the Japanese Army that was instructed to reorganize Japan along militaristic lines was called the Sakurakai. During World War Two, kamikaze pilots would have cherry blossoms painted on the sides of their planes, and some carried branches from cherry blossoms on their missions. The national Japanese rugby team is nicknamed the "Brave Blossoms", as they wore cherry blossom stickers on their shirts. A folk song was even made about them that you may have sung in the 5th-grade chorus called "Sakura".

So how did cherry blossoms come to the United States? It involves a man named Mayor Yukio Ozaki. During a trip to the United States in 1910, Ozaki met some members of the Japanese-American community and decided they needed some cherry blossoms not only as a gift but to strengthen the U.S-Japanese relationship. They originally shipped the trees to America, but the trees had been worn down, so they shipped 3020 cherry blossom saplings to Washington DC. On March 27, 1912, two cherry blossoms were planted on the White House lawn by First Lady Helen Taft and Viscountess Chinda Iwa, wife of Ambassador Chinda Sutemi. Ever since that moment, cherry blossoms grow in Washington DC and the White House lawn.

This is how cherry blossoms came to and how they were introduced to the United States.

The Story Behind St. Patrick's Day

Saint Patrick's Day

The holidays don't end in December! The season of spring has its own share of fun festivities to celebrate or partake in, one of the most discernible being St. Patrick's Day, which occurred on March 17. St. Patrick's Day is a holiday that commemorates the death of St. Patrick of Ireland, and has grown to become an overall celebration of Irish culture. From leprechauns to four-leaf clovers to Saint Patrick himself, learn about St. Patrick's Day and how it came to be one of the most celebrated holidays of the spring season!

The Story of Saint Patrick

Saint Patrick was born on the British Isles during the reign of the Romans, around the year 390. The legend denotes that at the age of 16, his town was attacked by Irish raiders who enslaved and took him to Ireland. It is said that six years later, he had a divine vision, which allowed him to escape and return to what is now modern-day England. He studied Christianity and became a priest, wanting to return to Ireland and convert the local peoples there to Christians. Today, he is widely known for doing just that, and becoming the patron saint of Ireland.

There are a plethora of famous tales involving Saint Patrick, such as how he drove snakes away from the Emerald Isle. The story goes that the saint was participating in a 40-day fast, but was attacked by snakes that plagued the lands. He used his staff to herd them all into the sea and away from the Emerald Isle forever, and such snakes have not been seen in Ireland to this day. This story is most likely not all that true, however, and is rather an allegory for how Saint Patrick replaced pagan beliefs (symbolized by the snakes) with Christianity.

Symbols and Traditions

The shamrock (clover) has been associated with St. Patrick's day and Irish customs for a long time. In the late 19th century, Irish citizens wore shamrocks to express Irish nationalism and their resentment towards the English, who were in control of Ireland at the time. There is also a story of how St. Patrick was able to convey the Christian concept of the Holy Trinity to the Irish people, using only a three-leaf shamrock, in which each leaf represented a component of the Holy Trinity, being the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Leprechauns are also eminent symbols of St. Patrick's Day. Stories of leprechauns first emerged during the 8th century, depicting them as three-foot tall creatures, who lived in hollow trees and guarded pots of gold in a mischievous manner. They are known for their signature green and gold hats, suits, and belt buckles (in fact, leprechauns were originally depicted as wearing red). Leprechauns, along with other small creatures like fairies, have been associated with St. Patrick's Day and Irish culture in general. They actually had their own holiday on March 13, four days before St. Patrick's Day.

Another tradition of this festival is to play some classic Irish music, distinguishable for its use of fiddles, whistles and harps. The genre of Irish music dates back more than 2,000 years, created by Celts who came from the Indo-European region. This is why Irish music is very similar to some types of Eastern music. Music was especially important to the Celts, as they were an oral culture who had not developed a writing system, like other civilizations at the time. Soon, the music was able to be written down and performed all over the world, resulting in the creation of modern-day Irish bands like the Dubliners and U2.

Modern Celebrations

St. Patrick's Day originated as a religious holiday to celebrate Saint Patrick and Christianity, but since then, it has spread across the world and developed new forms of celebration in each country. For example, from 1762, there has been a grand St. Patrick's Day parade in New York every year, followed by the traditions of munching on cabbage and corned beef, and dying the Chicago River green. In Sydney, Australia, the lights of the Sydney Opera House are turned green for the occasion. In Tokyo, Japan, a parade takes place where people and their dogs dress up in green-clad costumes to traverse the streets. The Worst Traffic Jam In History

At some point, we've all been really frustrated by traffic jams. They're holding us up from where we need to go! But most traffic jams disperse in the matter of only a few minutes or fractions of an hour. Have you ever wondered about how it would feel to be stuck in the longest traffic jam in history? Well, you don't have to wonder anymore, because this is the story of the 8-year, world's longest traffic jam.



This story took place in the Suez Canal, which was built between the Sinai Peninsula and the rest of Egypt in 1869. This canal changed international trade and saved Europe-Southeast Asia trade a distance of 8,900 kilometers. This dramatically saved time and money, so no one wanted to imagine the consequences of this canal temporarily or permanently closing. However, exactly this happened in the late 1960s. The relationship between neighboring countries Egypt and Israel was unstable, and both countries were ready for war.

15 cargo ships entered the canal on June 5th, 1967. While they were almost halfway through their 12 hour journey through the canal, war between Israel and Egypt broke out, when the former launched an air attack that drew havoc in the area near the canal. Within 6 days, Israel had conquered the Sinai Peninsula, which meant that the border between the two countries was the canal itself! Egypt stopped all use of the canal and decided to sabotage it by sinking ships and over a million mines so that any attempt to use the canal would be fatal. This meant that people's nightmares really happened, and cargo ships had to travel the long route to Southeast Asia, driving up prices of goods all over the world.

However, life was to continue on as usual, even in the cargo ships itself. All the ships were rounded into 3 groups and the majority of the crew was sent home, except 10 workers who would keep maintenance of the ship. The crew of 10 would rotate every six months. Although the 15 cargo ships came from a handful of countries, they all bonded together for the time they spent alongside each other. They had their own 1968 Olympics! Along with that, the British held football games and lifeboat races. The Germans held church services every Sunday. The Bulgarians hosted movies, while the Swedes hosted pool parties. The French also grew a community garden.

The sole American ship was knocked down 6 years later in a fight when a stray missile hit the ship, which drowned. Fighting ended soon after that, and the Sinai Peninsula was returned to Egypt, but cleaning up the canal of its ships and mines took about two more years. Finally, the ships were let free, 8 years later. The German ships were the only ones able to return to their country, where they were greeted by 30,000 people.

This was the story of the world's longest traffic jam. Sure, it may be an unusual story, but the most interesting stories are frequently unusual. So the next time that you complain about a traffic jam that's holding you back from somewhere that you need to go, just think about this incident and happily direct your mental pain at the people that had to spend months on a stationary ship!

Orange Upside-Down Cake

Ingredients:

Caramel Topping



- 2 Medium Oranges
- ¾ C Granulated Sugar
- 4 ½ Tbs Unsalted Butter
- ¼ Tsp Salt

Cake

- 2 C All-Purpose Flour
- 1 Tsp Baking Powder
- ½ Tsp Baking Soda
- ¾ Tsp Salt
- ½ C Unsalted Butter (Temp.)
- 1 C Granulated Sugar
- 3 Large Eggs
- 1 Tsp Vanilla Extract
- 1 Tsp Grated Orange Zest
- 1 C Buttermilk



Procedure:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 F. Then lightly butter the pan up, and slice the oranges thinly, and line them up on the cake tin
- 2. Add all of the ingredients of the caramel, into a medium pot, and keep it on medium heat. In around 10 minutes it will become an amber color, and then you have to take it off the stove. Slowly, spread the caramel onto the pan.
- 3. Whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt in a medium-sized bowl. Set that aside, and put butter and sugar in a bowl to cream it till it is fluffy. Slowly add in the eggs, vanilla extract, and the orange zest.
- 4. Incorporate the dry mixture, and the buttermilk into the wet mixture. Combine it well, and then add it to the pan slowly.
- 5. Bake the cake for 35-40 minutes. Enjoy!

Pastel Butter Cookies

Ingredients:

- 1 C Toasted Almonds
- 2 C All-purpose flour
- ½ Tsp Salt
- ½ Tsp Ground Cinnamon

- 2 Sticks Unsalted Butter
- 1 C Sugar
- Freeze-dried berries

Procedure:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350. In a large mixing bowl, mix the almonds, flour, salt, and cinnamon until it is finely ground
- 2. Beat the butter and 1/2 cup of sugar in another mixing bowl until it is light and fluffy, and slowly and the extract. Mix in the almond mixture slowly.
- 3. Drop the dough onto a baking sheet and bake them for 14 to 16 minutes.
- 4. Mix the other ½ cup of sugar and freeze-dried berries, to get the frosting.


3. "Spring break or something idk I'm not American"

Although these titles below do not cover many shows, *I* believe them to be two of the best!


#1: iCarly(2007-2012)

Behind The Scenes Of A Movie: What Does A VFX Artist Do?

Movies. We all have our favorites, our classics that we continue to revisit every couple of movie nights. And don't lie: there must have been at least one film that caught your attention, whether it's because of the amazing storyline, or because of the mind blowing cinematography. And the fact that it's the twenty-first century means that our cinemas are more advanced than ever before, providing magical experiences for us through powerful storytelling.

Every time we watch a movie, we are pulled into a world that looks and feels real, even though it never really is.

No matter how unrealistic the story might be, the special and visual effects added makes us feel much differently. See, here's the thing though. We only see the *completed* version, a product of the hundreds of hours of filming, editing, and post production directors, actors, and creative artists have poured their souls into. Without all of that work, all we would be watching is a couple of people awkwardly delivering lines when they're cued to. There would be no explosions, no little alien creatures on screen to amuse us. There wouldn't even be any of those majestic backgrounds that we're so used to being there, we wouldn't even realize it's all that important unless it's gone. So how exactly is this done? How are we able to see things that don't actually exist? The answer lies in visual effects, more commonly known as VFX.

VFX artists are gods. Literally. They can transform a film to a point where it looks nothing like the original footage. After a movie has finished initial filming, all of the footage is sent to the VFX artists along with a description of things that the directors and screenwriters would like to see implemented in the movie. The simple stuff is usually not noticeable to us, including things like lighting, texturing, basic shading, and even fixing scars and blemishes on an actor's face that's not supposed to be a part of the film. The harder stuff includes things like creating creatures like robots, aliens, wild animals, or explosions, beheadings (yeah, they're not actually chopping a person's head off), and sometimes even superhero suits. Let's take the Avengers, for example. I hate to break it to you, but that final fight scene in "Avengers: Endgame" isn't real (And neither are any of their fight scenes like, ever. Sorry!)

Well, the scene is real. But what the actors filmed is not what it looks like on screen. During filming, the entire Avengers cast were standing in a green room, with most of them in physical costumes that were later edited to look more realistic. And the entire background is completely CGI (Computer Generated Images). That's not even the crazy part though. In the scene, the Avengers were supposed to be running, and simply because it's a movie they had to all be in sync.

To do this, they were placed on top of *treadmills*. Yup. Treadmills. They ran on treadmills, keeping everyone at a constant speed. In post production, the VFX artists (yet again, being the gods that they are) removed the treadmills and made it look like everyone was running on solid ground using visual effects and editing software like Adobe After Effects, Nuke, and Fusion. Oh and by the way, our favorite character Hulk? He's not big and green in real life. The actor, Mark Ruffalo, has to wear a black suit with colored stickers every time he has a scene as Hulk to provide a reference point for VFX artists when they transform him. Just . . . putting it out there.

How did they do this? Well, they trained for years. Went to VFX and digital production schools, and practiced. A lot. No one gets to this level of editing within a week. But it's a really cool job, and largely underappreciated. Being a VFX artist means you either make or break the movie, but oftentimes we don't remember that because we're too occupied with being enraptured by their work. So the next time you watch a movie (preferably Sci-Fi), think about how this work of art came to be.
