Ma-a-ad Maddie!

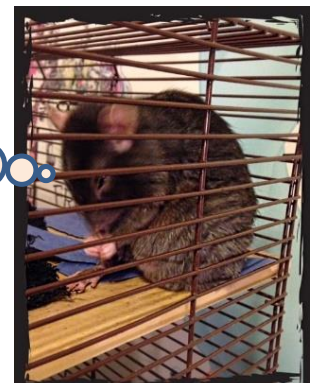
Our cat, Maddie, did not like sharing HER house with the ratties. She said *hiss!* and stayed on her cat tree.

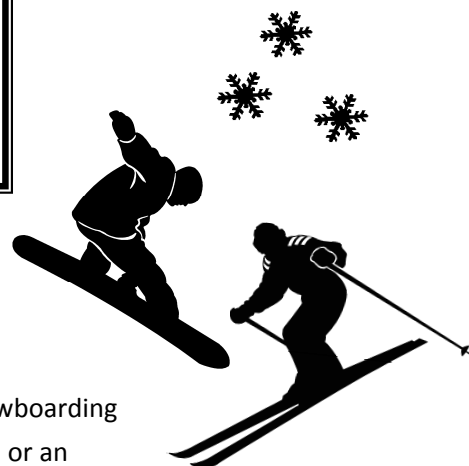

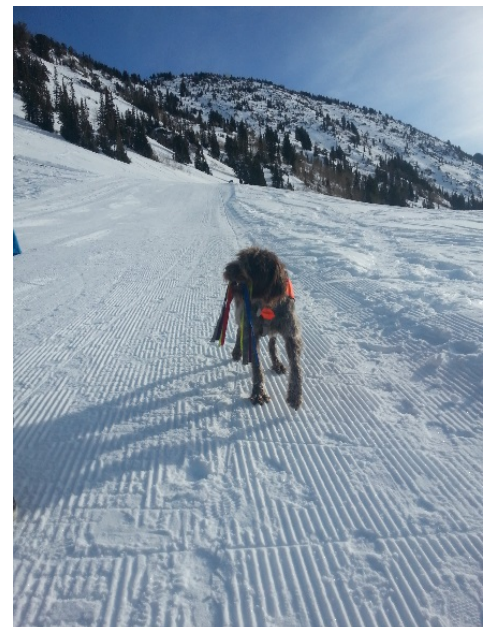
