Dear Episcopal Collegiate Community,

It is hard to believe that we are entering the final weeks of the 2020-21 school year. I don't have to tell you that we are in the midst of the busiest time. Every week brings one of our year-ending events, traditions, and ceremonies, including honor society recognitions, Lower School Field Day, Blazer Ceremony, 8th Grade Moving-up Ceremony, 5th Grade Recognition, Baccalaureate, Class Day, and Commencement. The list goes on. I have no doubt that these final weeks will be exciting and memorable ones for all of our families.

In the midst of our end-of-year busyness, we must also start to prepare for the 2021-22 school year. I am pleased to report that those preparations are well underway. In that regard, I am sure that many of you are wondering about next year in terms of how we will operate given the uncertainty of how the pandemic may continue to impact our community. Although it is a bit early to know for sure what the health situation will be in Little Rock in August, current trends are favorable. Covid cases are down significantly from their highest levels, and vaccination rates continue to improve. It is also significant that the Pfizer-BioNTech Covid vaccine was recently approved for children 12 to 15. In addition, new CDC guidelines, announced just yesterday, clear the way for fully vaccinated people to resume most activities without masks and distancing. (We are still digesting this news trying to determine the impact, if any, on how we operate the school for the last two weeks of school.)

In the coming weeks, we will continue to gather more information, including the vaccination rates for our students 12 and older, so that we can make informed decisions about how we move forward. We are hopeful that guidelines for operating schools will continue to evolve and move us toward normalcy. Although it is too early to finalize our approach, one decision that has been made is that we will prioritize in-person learning. For 2021-22, the synchronous, virtual learning option will only be available to accommodate documented medical situations of a serious nature and decisions about its availability will be made on a case by case basis. More complete guidelines will be communicated this summer.

To help support our efforts to open school in the best way possible, we encourage all in our school community who are eligible to get vaccinated.

Our goal is to provide you with our next update in June, which allows adequate time to coordinate with our medical panel. Let us stay vigilant so that we can finish the year well. We thank you for your continued support.

We're looking forward to next week, when we'll celebrate many of our traditional end-of-year events with our students. On Wednesday, May 19, we

will recognize our current juniors during our Chapel time as they transition to senior status and receive their senior blazers. Rising seniors and up to four members of their household will be able to attend in person, and live streaming will be available through the school's <u>YouTube channel</u> during the event for those who are unable to join us in person. The event will begin at 9:20 am in our Championship Gymnasium, and guests should not arrive any earlier than 9:00 am.

On the evening of Thursday, May 20, we will hold our annual Baccalaureate service at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral. Attendance at this event is limited to members of the senior class and up to four family members as guests. Baccalaureate will begin at 5:00 pm, with live streaming available through the Cathedral.

On Friday, May 21, the Upper School will celebrate Class Day.
