Council Member Weissberger, seconded by Council Member Campbell made a motion for a 5 minute recess. Motion carried unanimously.

Meeting reconvened at 8:02 PM

Mayor George F. Apel to make a presentation to the Town Council on various topics.

- Per the mayor’s request Town Administrator Ward reached out to ECHN regarding the discontinuation of cardiac services. ECHN informed him that they were discontinuing the services due to lack of demand.
- Amerbelle winterization efforts are on the way. Mayor Apel met with Congressman Courtney, DEEP Commissioner Esty and several others to discuss options moving forward. There are several agenda items on tonight’s agenda pertaining to funding for Amerbelle.
- Administration re-negotiated the electricity contract and will be saving approximately \$485,000 per year for the next 5 years.
- Mayor Apel has a competition going on between Departments to see who can raise the most food items to donate to HVCC during the month of October. The winners will receive a continental breakfast served by Mayor Apel on November 2, 2012. HVCC and Foodshare will also be present at the breakfast. All funds raised will be put into an account at Foodshare for HVCC to draw down upon as needed.
- Mayor Apel has pledged \$500.00 to Foodshare for HVCC and challenges Town Council members to match his pledge.
- The festival of the bands is coming up this weekend at RHS
- Skinner Road School “walk to school” day was a success again this year.
- Mayor Apel received notice from DOT that Skinner Road will receive the grant they applied for.
- There are 2 additional agenda items for tonight.
- A fire broke out at Court Street Towers and it was contained to 1 apartment. Mayor Apel thanked the Fire Department and Housing Authority for their response to the emergency.
- The Board of Education and Town Council will hold a joint meeting on November 7, 2012 at the Board of Education board room to discuss the new Information Technology Department efforts.
- Winterfest kicks off on December 7 at 6:00 PM

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- 4 new AED's were installed at the Town Hall, 1 at the Lottyst building, 1 at Center 375 and 1 at the senior center

1. **Request the Town Council endorse a resolution of support for the Capitol Region Council of Governments (CRCOG) Back Office Service Sharing Study.** (See a

PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, Section 5 of Public Act 11-61 (An Act Concerning Responsible Growth) passed by the Connecticut General Assembly provides incentive grants to regional planning organizations for projects that involve shared services; and

WHEREAS, the Capitol Region Council of Governments (CRCOG) is acting as a convener and facilitator of service sharing projects around the CRCOG region; and

WHEREAS, on November 16, 2011 the Policy Board of CRCOG passed a resolution authorizing development and submittal of an application package to the State Office of Policy and Management for funding under the Regional Performance Incentive Grant Program, on behalf of the Council's member municipalities, and municipalities of other regions, which are participating in Council initiatives; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Elected Officials and municipal staff of the Capitol Region have developed a list of service sharing project proposals that will be included in this application package, to the benefit of individual municipalities and the region as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Vernon has expressed an interest in taking part in the projects proposal entitled Back Office Service Sharing Study.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Vernon Town Council do hereby endorse the above referenced Regional Performance Incentive Grant Program Project proposal and authorizes the Town Administrator to sign all necessary agreements and take all necessary actions to allow for the town's participation in this program.

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Section 1 was amended by adding (e) as follows: (e) There is hereby established a program for the collection and disposal of recyclables from all occupants of residential dwelling units, senior citizen age-restricted condominiums and stand alone residential units as defined in Ordinance 241 located within this municipality. With the exception of residential condominiums said program shall not apply to residential dwelling units of more than six (6) units, apartments, or business, commercial and industrial establishments.

The word "recyclables" replaces the words "solid waste".

Section 2 (p) was amended by replacing the words "Section 1(e)" for the words "Section 2".

Discussion took place. Motion as amended carried unanimously.
