Working at GMS

GMS is searching for a temporary, part-time Learning Specialist to partner with students, faculty and parents for students identified as having nontypical learning profiles. The ideal candidate will have experience serving as a case manager and be knowledgeable about effective intervention strategies and academic support options. They will have a passion for broadening the world of learning for students challenged by traditional educational pedagogies. They will be friendly, enthusiastic, proactive, and forward-thinking. Ability to speak Spanish is a huge plus! The successful candidate will need to be detail-oriented, well organized, have superior patience and collaboration skills, and be able to produce solutions appropriate to meet GMS standards.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- Read and interpret evaluations/assessments and subsequently design a GMS Learning Plan for students with identified learning needs.
- Work in partnership with families, teachers, and students to understand evaluations, discuss learning plans, and identify next steps.
- Work in close partnership with faculty to implement an academic support structure with specific, usable, classroom accommodations and recommendations to support student learning.
- Collaborate with faculty, staff, and families to monitor and communicate student progress.
- Gather information about students via teacher meetings and classroom observations, and make referrals and recommendations to outside professionals to families when appropriate.
- Oversee and monitor extended time standardized testing processes.

What we look for in a Learning Specialist Candidate

- Formal training as an Educational Specialist, Learning Specialist, Educational Therapist, or related field.
- Background in classroom teaching and experience working with middle-school age students, in both special education and mainstream populations.
- Expertise in the area of learning differences, especially dyslexia, attention deficit, processing speed, and executive functioning.
- Extensive training/experience interpreting psychoeducational evaluations and other assessments.

- Understanding of and commitment to the GMS educational philosophy.
- Ability to positively engage partners and collaborate closely with fellow educators.
- Ability to be a self-starter and work independently.
- A cooperative team approach with colleagues and a willingness to take on responsibilities beyond those explicitly defined.
