
Trinity Presbyterian School Rising Fifth Grade Summer Reading 2021



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READING MAKES A DIFFERENCE!


Reading in this century demands students develop high levels of literacy to be able to compete in a post-secondary world. Research indicates that students who read more, read better and have higher reading achievement. Students who read independently develop more expansive vocabularies and achieve higher levels of reading and writing development. These benefits are particularly true for students who have daily opportunities to read. Lower school's cumulative summer reading program is designed to provide our students the opportunity to be academically challenged, be ahead of the literacy curve, and compete with other college preparatory students.

Fifth Grade Summer Reading Requirements

Fifth graders are required to read two novels, this summer, and complete the attached Venn diagram.

- 1. Hatchet by Gary Paulsen
 - All fifth grade students will read the novel *Hatchet*, an award-winning classic. Paulsen's survival story, in which all others are compared, is a page-turning, heart-stopping adventure following a young boy's survival after a plane crash in the Canadian wilderness.
- 2. Wild River by W. Rodman Philbrick
 All fifth grade students will read the novel Wild River. Philbrick
 weaves teamwork and realistic dangers into a page-turning
 survival story as campers are sent down a raging river on a life-ordeath adventure.
- 3. After reading, students will complete the attached Venn diagram to compare and contrast the two novels. In addition, students will explain which novel was liked the most and why.

This assignment is due on the first full day of school. There will be additional assignments to assess the students' understanding of this material.
