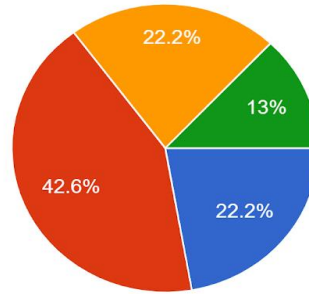

The goal is to analyze the data to support the instructional shift for the rest of the school year or to see if adjustments need to be made.</p>	3 of 48
2	Full Return to School	Brian Siesto shared that some suburban Monroe County school districts are actively looking at a 4-6 week timeline for return to full time in-person instruction for the remainder of the school year. Focus areas that will need additional planning include social distancing in buses, the cafeteria, music lessons, and increased traffic support. VCSD is looking into all of the challenges and changes that would need to happen in order for students to return to full-time in-person learning safely.	
3	Graduation and Senior Class Events	<p>Brian Siesto spoke about graduation planning for the Class of 2021. It is scheduled to be held on campus at Corbit Field on Thursday, June 24th at 6pm. (The rain dates are Friday, June 25th and Saturday, June 26th) Along with the Senior Class Advisors Anne Stekl and Danyelle Westbrook, administrators are looking into an end of year formal celebration. With social guidelines rapidly changing, the following events will be planned accordingly:</p> <p>May 1 – Decision Day Car Parade May 28/June 18 – Senior Celebration Day June 4 – Senior Cap and Gown Walk through campus</p>	
4	End of Year Exams	Advanced Placement testing is scheduled throughout the month of May this year with both “in-person” and “digital” options. The district is analyzing social distancing requirements for student testing. IB testing will be following a regular schedule. New York State will require end-of-year Regents testing in the following subjects: English/Language 11, Earth Science, Living Environment, and Algebra 1.
