Medication at School

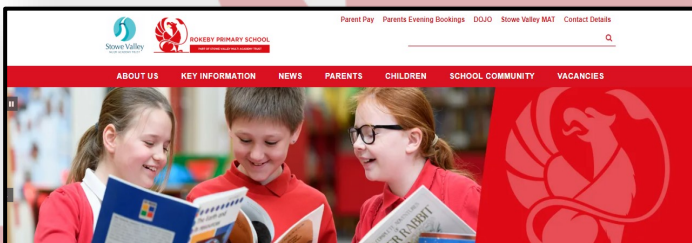
If your child has any medication at school including inhalers, please can you visit the front office to collect an updated form to give us your authorisation to administer the medication if needed.

activeCamps

This year our holiday camp in Rugby is based at Rugby School, a partner of our regular site, Bilton Grange Preparatory School. Our children's multi-activity camps are for children aged from 3 to 14 years and have a wide range of fun activities for kids to enjoy during the school holidays.

Typical age groups:

3-5 YRS 6-8 YRS 9+ YRS

(Actual groupings may vary slightly at each site)

Whether your child is interested in sport, arts, crafts or a bit of everything, we have activities to suit everybody. Children attending Active Camps will take part in activities ranging from large scale painting and mosaic masterpieces to team building games and obstacle courses.

Everything is a little different at Active Camps as we are exploring new activities and games to make sure we stick to the social distancing guidelines!

Children will be part of a group or 'bubble' with a maximum of 15 children of similar ages. Each bubble will have consistent staff members to keep the number of people that children come into contact with at the very minimum. An individual camp kit will be provided for use during the session, including equipment such as colouring pens and pencils, paintbrushes and a range of other arts and crafts equipment. All of this is to reduce the risk of infection by avoiding sharing equipment.
