



THE PROGRAM BUDGET:

The salaries and benefits of all teachers, guidance counselors, aides, monitors, psychologists, nurses, social workers, and speech therapists. Also included are textbooks and equipment, library costs, transportation, co-curricular programs and interscholastic athletics.

THE CAPITAL BUDGET:

Operations and maintenance costs, including salaries and benefits for custodial staff, debt service from capital projects, utilities, cleaning supplies, tax certiorari, and court-ordered costs.

THE ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET:

The salaries and benefits of administrators, supervisors and administrative clerical staff, public information and printing, curriculum and staff development, school board-related costs, tax collection, and legal services.

BUDGET NOTICE WITH CONTINGENCY

In the event the budget is not approved, the District may conduct a second vote or adopt a contingency budget. A contingency budget would include reductions required by Section 2023 of the Education Law, including the use of school facilities and fields.

Property Tax Levy

New York State law requires school districts to establish a tax cap, or maximum allowable levy limit. Each school district determines its cap from a complicated formula. Allowable Levy is set at the Cost of Living, CPI (1.23%) or the state's tax cap of 2%, whichever is less. The SFCSD proposed 0.9% Tax Levy increase is below the Maximum Allowable Levy Limit of 2.97%.

Town School Tax Bills Using the Basic and Enhanced STAR Exemption:

The tax bills to the left are estimated using a \$100,000 home and rates from the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance. The Seneca Falls CSD does not develop the equalization rates and STAR exemption amounts. The Town of Seneca Falls properties are expected to have an equalization rate of 85%. The Town of Fayette and Tyre equalization rates are estimated to be at 100%. The 2021-22 exemptions can be found at: www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/star45.htm.

School tax rates are set for each town and approved by SFCSD Board of Education in July or August.





WHERE AND HOW DO I VOTE?

All Seneca Falls Central School District voters must be U.S. Citizens, at least 18 years of age, and a resident for the past 30 days. Voting on the School Budget, Bus Purchases, and Board of Education elections will take place from 1:00 to 8:00 PM on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 in the Seneca Falls Middle School Gym (95 Troy Street). Please note the change in venue from previous years. The map below illustrates the Middle School Gym parking and entrance for voting. The annual public hearing for the school budget will be on Thursday, May 6th at 6:00 PM. A link will be provided on the district website for the community to attend virtually. ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Residents who will not be able to appear in person on May 18 may apply for an absentee ballot at the District Office (98 Clinton Street). If the absentee ballot is to be mailed to the voter, the application must be submitted at least seven days prior to the vote. If the absentee ballot is to be picked up by the voter in person, applications will be accepted until May 17. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk by 5:00 PM on May 18, 2021.


VOTER SAFETY

Our traditional polling site has been relocated to accommodate CDC guidelines and provide proper social distancing. Voting will take place in the Seneca Falls Middle School Gym. The parking lot can be accessed off of Mynderse Street to the back of the SFMS gym. Voters will enter the side entrance of the gym (door facing the track—see image). Signs and markers will be provided to direct voter traffic. Doors will be propped and voting machines will be appropriately distanced. Please adhere to the following guidance:

- PPE and hand sanitizer will be accessible
- Voters must wear face masks and social distance
- Please limit all nonessential visitors
- Voters are discouraged from greeting others with physical contact
- Stay home if you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Voters may see greater traffic between the hours of 1-3 PM
