- Arranging food distributions for home? Yes
- Understand that some students' days may be more successful if preferred food items are available then subtly put these things together when staff request—always thinking outside the box and beyond the published menu to make it happen. Yes!!
- Not to mention they know each student and staff member by name—a challenging undertaking, but essential when trying to get hundreds of orders out to all of the classrooms!

More importantly, however, Shari and Yvette know the importance food has in students' lives. They understand that, before students can work on academics and achieve, they need nutrients. The "how can we help you" question Shari and Yvette ask when you visit, results in a number of different responses. No matter the request—you'll never hear "no" as an answer.
