Dear Families,

This year, students entering 2nd and 3rd grades are embarking on a special project, a unique book club called *One School, One Book*. It is a program designed to engage and involve parents in the essential task of fostering the love of reading in children. This summer, students entering 2nd and 3rd grades will be reading the Newbery Honor novel, *The Hundred Dresses*, by Eleanor Estes. The story involves the important themes of friendship, acceptance, compassion, and regret, and it prompts the reader to think about how to treat others with kindness and respect.

The *One School, One Book* initiative is designed to create a shared learning experience between our school community and home. Every 2nd and 3rd grade family is asked to read the book over the course of the summer, with the goal of promoting a shared reading experience through families reading aloud with their children. Reading aloud to your child has tremendous educational benefits and can be a source of enjoyment for both students and parents. Read-alouds are not only enjoyable for beginning readers, but are just as essential for students in the upper elementary grades, as well. Reading comprehension improves as students listen to and discuss events, characters, and motivations. They learn to predict what will happen next as well as increase their vocabulary knowledge and build syntactic awareness. To facilitate this process, families can access a **Discussion Guide** on the AIM website which features questions that can be used to talk about the book at home. Our utmost goal is to encourage a lifelong enjoyment of reading, a gift your child will treasure forever.

In addition to reading the novel, students **entering 3rd grade** are asked to create a **Summer Reading Project** that reflects what they have learned after reading the novel. Ideas for projects, listed on the **Summer Reading Project Selections Sheet**, range from creating a diorama or a video, to writing a new ending for the book. Students **entering 2**nd grade may write a sentence or draw a picture about the book or they are welcome to do any of the projects on the Summer Reading Project Selections Sheet. Students will be able to share their projects at our **One Book, One School Celebration** in mid-September during the school day.

Along with reading *The Hundred Dresses*, we strongly encourage you to support your child in reading independently, reading with you and listening to audiobooks as much as possible. Continuous reading throughout the summer will support in maintaining fluency progress and prevent summer learning loss.
