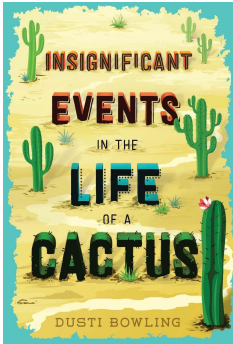

### **Required annotations for *Insignificant Events in the Life of a Cactus*:**

Annotations are a fancy way for saying “make notes in your book.” Annotating is like talking to the book. It also helps you have great conversations with your classmates about the book. We’ll be discussing this one as soon as we come back to school. As you read, please take notes on:

- Unfamiliar words
- Figurative language (similes, metaphors, idioms, personification, etc.)
- Important events (inciting incident, climax, resolution, etc.)
- Questions
- Surprises
- Connections to life (movies, other books, things you know,)
- Parts you love (or not so much),
- Predictions
- Other brilliant thoughts.
