Mynderse Academy 1938 Football Team

During the era of single wing football, no Mynderse team approached the records set by the 1938 eleven. The first of two teams in the school's history to be unbeaten, untied, and unscored upon, Mynderse racked up 170 points while holding the opposition scoreless. The record was as follows:

Only Penn Yan was a serious threat to this record, running multiple plays inside Mynderse territory. However, the Mynderse defense refused to yield, keeping Penn Yan out of the end zone. The season ended with a 41-0 trouncing of archrival Waterloo.

Three Mynderse starters, tailback John Stromak, end Louie Pioli, and guard John Marsh were selected as first team members on the annual Rochester Times-Union All Tri-County eleven. Joe Comernisky, Ray Salotti, and Gordon Amidon were placed on the second team, and "Nooky" Reinbold and Bill Moyer received honorable mention. No other team was as well represented.

The 1938 team was the culmination of a string of great successes under Coaches Baker and Wormuth during which Mynderse won 18 games, lost 3, and scored 388 points to its opponent's 77.
