Mission Statement

Cleveland Central Catholic High School is a coeducational school rooted in the Gospel values of Jesus Christ and focused on college and career readiness. Our mission is to challenge and encourage our students to excel academically, to deepen their faith in God, and to live a life of service, so they may face the future with confidence and hope.



ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Centrally located in the middle of Cuyahoga County, Cleveland Central Catholic is a Diocesan owned and operated, co-educational, comprehensive school for students in grades 9 through 12. With an enrollment of about 500 students, CCC is large enough to provide ample opportunities for student activities while also being small enough for each student to be known by name. The school offers a wide variety of activities that provide our students with safe and fun ways to develop skills and make friends for life.

Cleveland Central Catholic was formed by the merger of four Roman Catholic Cleveland high schools - St. John Cantius, Lourdes Central, St. Michael the Archangel, and St. Stanislaus. CCC's first year of operation was the 1969-70 scholastic year. The consolidation of the Scranton Campus (St. Michael's) and the Forman Campus (St. Stanislaus) took place in 2003, completing the transition into a one-campus school with all activities on the St. Stanislaus block in Slavic Village.

During the ensuing years, in cooperation with the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, Central Catholic successfully completed a \$13 million capital campaign. This campaign added over 25,000 square feet of new construction that includes new classrooms and labs, meeting space, a chapel, and a gymnasium. The new addition to the school opened in 2006. The campaign also increased the school's endowment fund, which helps fund academic scholarships and tuition assistance for those with demonstrated financial need. Over a six-year period, enrollment climbed over 40 percent.

Through a partnership with the City of Cleveland, the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland and the Third Federal Foundation, Central Catholic opened a new athletic facility in 2010. A new football and track stadium, named Ben Stefanski, II Stadium, was dedicated in September of 2010. In addition, areas for baseball, softball, track and field events were renovated. Over 99% of the Class of 2020 graduated and more than 86% of the students were accepted into either a 2 or 4-year college or university.

Religion classes for all students challenge them to put their faith into action and live the Gospel message. Prayer services and retreats led by peers and faculty reinforce the importance of Christian faith in their lives. Students also celebrate the Liturgy and some share the Eucharist in the Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus, located right on our campus.

The school is guided by these five Gospel values and a related philosophy of education:

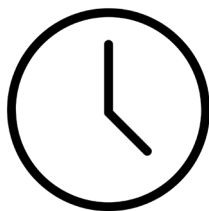
- Commitment: Cherishing commitment and fortified by faith, we invest our energies to become responsible persons.

The President is the chief executive of the operational vitality for the school, including development/advancement, marketing/enrollment, finances, and capital projects. The President leads and articulates the school's mission and vision, creates and implements strategic plans, and builds and nurtures relationships. Applicants must foster a strong Catholic identity, value diversity, and possess effective leadership and interpersonal skills.

While the President must have a demonstrated capacity for broad institutional leadership, it is possible that the prospective President could have attained this experience through a variety of different career paths, including primary, secondary, or tertiary education; non-profit management; or work in the corporate or public sector. 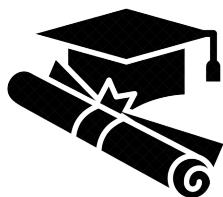
prospective President must have expert knowledge of and a proven record of institutional advancement by identifying, cultivating, and developing stakeholder partnerships and philanthropic support that will ensure its continued accessibility, success, and sustainability. An advanced degree in education or business-related fields is preferred. The ideal candidate will have a passion for Catholic education, possess an understanding of the President/Principal model of administration, and be comfortable leading a committed board of advisors. Additionally, the successful candidate will have expertise in business and financial management, as well as a proven track record of acquiring necessary funding through the solicitation of major gifts and capital campaign contributions. He or she must be experienced with strategic planning and have the requisite executive level experience to lead a school community. With a visible executive presence in and outside of the school community, the President must be able to advance the marketing and institutional advancement initiatives of the school.

The position of President at Cleveland Central Catholic High School is unique to any other school in the greater Cleveland region. This position requires the President to have business acumen, strategic vision, strong external presence, and to recognize and promote the value of being Catholic school for students of all faiths.
