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INTRODUCTION

The topic of this Capstone final project is "How do Moroccan youths' views differ from their Palestinian and Israeli peers on the future options for peace in the Middle East?" The humanitarian crisis between Israel and Palestine has affected multiple generations of families and it is important for future generations to understand different perspectives since that is how the conflict between Israel and Palestine will be solved. The research in this Capstone compares what youth in Morocco, Palestine, and Israel believe is the best way to solve the conflict between Israel and Palestine.

DIFFERENT PEACE PROPOSALS

Two State Solution:

The two state solution was first outlined/agreed to during the Oslo Accords. Palestine would have it's own independent state, and both nations would have their own governments (Fisher, 2016).

One State Solution:

There are two variations of the One State Solution; One is that both nations come together, which seems implausible. The second variationn is that Israel annexes Palestine and takes complete control (Beauchamp, 2018).

Trump's Peace Plan:

Proposed by former US president Trump, is mainly focused on the Israeli perspective. It states that more of Palestine should be given to Israel and that borders be re-written by the Israeli government (Specia, 2020).

DEMOGRAPHICS ON RESEARCH CANDIDATES

I conducted 30 interviews; 15 Moroccan, 10 Palestinian, & 5 Israeli. I received a 50% response rate.


