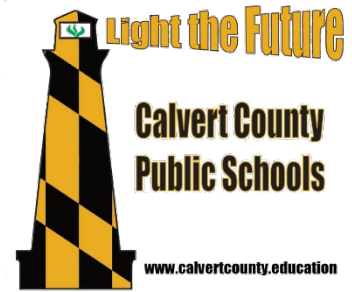
### Student Support
