#### Blencathra visit

On Monday 17 May, Year 12 geographers travelled to Blencathra in the Lake District to undertake fieldwork in preparation for the Independent Investigation element of the A-level course.

They were the first guests at the Field Studies

Council (FSC) centre since the lifting of restrictions.

The group studied a corrie on the Borrowdale Fells and looked at glacial depositional features in Borrowdale itself. Fieldwork techniques for the collection of placemaking data were practised in Carlisle.

Tutor Pippa Cowley provided detailed guidance on the techniques students can choose from to collect data for their investigation and the evening classroom session was used to consider approaches to data analysis and presentation using geographical information systems.

Our thanks to Pippa and the FSC for welcoming the group and to the Lakes weather for giving the group the only two days without rain in the month!

### A notice from Schoolblazer

As part of our drive to reduce our plastic usage, we will no longer include a plastic returns bag in orders that are sent in cardboard boxes. We know that just 8% of these returns bags are used by parents, meaning over 28,000 bags were thrown away last summer. Removing these is obviously an easy way to cut down on our plastic waste.

To further reduce waste, we will no longer include a printed returns label with all orders, parents will need to login to their account and request a return online, whereby a returns label will be generated and they'll need to print these off at home. This is clearly communicated on the dispatch note enclosed with every order.

A reminder that tracksuit bottoms are required as part of Dame Allan's PE kit and that we will be stocking a girls' trouser option as part of the uniform.

# Fenham Heritage Walk

#### Thursday 24 June 2021, 4.30-5.30pm, Senior Schools

#### Walk 4.30pm to 5.30pm

Join local historian Mike Greatbatch on a short guided walking tour of Fenham and discover how the area was developed as a garden suburb in the years before the Great War, and how Dame Allan's came to be built on land sold for development in the 1920s as Fenham became established as a middle class suburb. Copies of archive plans and images will be used to illustrate this history throughout the walk.

The walk starts at St James & St Basil's Church (west entrance), then Moorside South to Wingrove Road South. Cross Wingrove Road South and continue to Nuns Moor Road and Bolbec Road. The walk will last 45 - 55 minutes, and we will finish at the Fowberry Crescent entrance to Dame Allan's Schools.

We will then move on to a large well ventilated marquee on the school field, where you will have the opportunity to meet the new Principal Will Scott and Chair of Governors lan Belsham as well as members of the staff team including Allanians Vicki MacDonald, Bursar and Geoff Laidler, Head of the Junior School. The event is an opportunity to learn more about what's happening in the Schools, including the upcoming North End Development project as well as a chance to come together for the first time after a long period of social isolation during lockdown.
