English language development (ELD)

is designed to provide students with consistent, explicit instruction in the vocabulary and language forms of academic English. Academic language proficiency is what we need to understand texts, write professionally, and engage in critical academic discourse. Students will regularly engage in language practice through reading, writing, speaking, and listening activities. Besides the support students receive in the ELD class, students receive instruction in their regular education classes designed to support their learning needs. GPSD7 uses two models for instructional support in the regular classroom. These models are the highly regarded SIOP and Constructing Meaning.

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

How does a student qualify for ELD services?

Upon registration parents complete a Language Use Survey which is reviewed to decide if students should be assessed to determine their English proficiency level using the English Language Proficiency Assessment or ELPA. Students qualify for services based on their ELPA score. Parents are informed of the student's qualification for service and asked to give permission to participate in the program.

Grants Pass School District provides services for students at elementary, middle and high school.

Our programs are located at the following schools. Transportation is provided for those students qualifying for services.

- Lincoln Elementary
- Redwood Elementary
- South Middle School
- Grants Pass High School

Students are placed in an ELD class by English proficiency level. Students with higher levels are grouped together whereas students needing more English language development are provided with more time and opportunities for practice in smaller groups. At the elementary level, students are provided services in a 30 minute block of time depending on proficiency level. For middle and high school students, the ELD class is credited as an elective period in the student's schedule. All students learn at different rates but it typically takes 5 to 7 years to become proficient in a second language.

Systematic ELD

Systematic ELD is an educational approach used in our ELD classes where students are taught lessons which incorporate the grammatical forms and functions of language, with an emphasis on fluency in language use. Students are taught lessons that emphasize the grammatical forms and functions of language. English language development focuses instruction on explicitly building receptive and expressive language.

SIOP

The Systematic Instruction and Observation Protocol (SIOP) provides for easily accessible language objectives that help the student to further their academic knowledge and content. Other proven strategies in the SIOP model help our ELL students learn academic English with confidence.

Constructing Meaning

Constructing Meaning is a set of tools and strategies teachers use to help students understand and work with the English language in regular classes. It helps teachers teach the vocabulary of their content. For example, they would focus on the language of math or science that students need to be successful or they might focus on speaking and writing activities where students practice new language. All teachers look carefully at what language students need to be successful on their assignments.
