



## Highly Capable Program K-12 Identification Process

Month	Grade	Action
September October	2	Screening for Young Scholars Programs with the NNAT (Naglieri Nonverbal Achievement Test)
October	K-5	Parents and guardians can make referrals for K/1 <sup>st</sup> grade students to receive targeted differentiation in their classrooms or intervention groups.
		2 <sup>nd</sup> – 5 <sup>th</sup> grade academic screening, parents are notified of students who meet the requirements for Highly Capable programs. Online referral and permission to test is acquired.
		Notification of students who meet requirements for Young Scholars; Consent to place is acquired.
November	2-5	Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) is given to students who met the academic screening requirements for Highly Capable cluster classrooms.
December	2-5	Consent to place is acquired for students who meet the qualifications for Highly Capable programs.
March	2 3 <sup>rd</sup> & 4 <sup>th</sup> if space allows	Students are identified who meet the screening and testing qualifications for placement in the self-contained HC program (KOG). Consent to place is acquired.
Sept-May	7-12	Parents, guardians or teacher may contact a building counselor who will work with the Hi Cap director to facilitate a referral.
