_____ Active in the Stonewall Uprising, they also founded S.T.A.R.—a group focused on providing shelter and support to queer, homeless youth.

_____ This tennis star is well-known for her match against Bobby Riggs. She beat him in straight sets in what is now remembered as "The Battle of the Sexes!"

_____ The civil and human rights leader who became one of the first openly gay elected officials in the United States when he won a seat on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in 1977. _____ Who said it? "It is not our differences that divide us. It is our inability to recognize, accept, and celebrate those differences."

_____ Known for her role in Netflix's *Orange is the New Black,* this icon was the first openly trans person to appear on a TIME magazine's cover.

_____ Famous for his role in *Lord of the Rings*, this gay icon even became an ordained minister, allowing him to officiate LGBTQ+ weddings!

_____ Often credited for creating the foundation of artificial intelligence and computer science, this mathematician also helped break several German code in WWII!
