Uniform Guide

Years nine, ten & eleven

To be purchased from the school shop (in person or via <http://www.millfieldshop.com/>):

- School regulation suits (plain navy trouser ~, navy pin-striped trousers or navy pin-striped skirt). Skirt hemline must fall between the knee and mid-calf
- Navy and white striped shirt ~*, white shirt, light blue and white striped blouse or white blouse should be worn tucked in
- V necked jumper with Millfield crest
- * Ties to be worn with navy and white striped shirt or white shirt
- ~ Only the plain navy trouser suit to be worn with navy and white striped shirt
- No tie to be worn with a blouse
- Plain white shirts or blouses may be purchased from other retailers

This means...

Everyday

1. School regulation striped suit (with either skirt or trouser option), to be worn with the school pale blue and white striped or plain white blouse worn tucked in. V necked navy jumper with Millfield crest.

OR

2. Plain navy school suit with the school navy and white striped shirt or plain white shirt worn tucked in with a school or house tie. V necked navy jumper with Millfield crest.

Other items

Socks or tights: Navy/Grey/Black. White ankle socks with skirt in "summer dress".

Shoes: plain, smart, flat black. No suede or canvas. No trainers or boots.

Coats: plain, dark colour. The hem to reach below suit jacket length. No embellishments e.g. fur trim, beading etc.

Jewellery: simple and discreet. No highly conspicuous earrings e.g. large hoops. No other piercings or any tattoos allowed. No visible ankle bracelets.

N.B.

N.B. very minimal make up permitted; no lipstick or nail varnish allowed.

Clean-shaven appearance at all times.

Hair: must be smart and not impair vision. Hair, if dyed, should be of a natural hair colour only.

Formal Dress: white shirt and school tie or white blouse (without a tie) for formal occasions e.g. Headmaster's Assembly, Wells Cathedral Service, away matches.

For occasions where games kit is appropriate, regulation school sports kit must be worn.



Clothing expectations

Option A: Senior (L6 and U6)

Trouser suit (black, dark grey or dark blue; feint pin stripe or very subtle check permitted). No leather or shiny fabric. Trousers must be straight legged (not skin tight), full length and with a visible vertical crease.

Optional waistcoat – plain or to match suit.

Shirt: A formal shirt with full length sleeves fastened at the cuff, a conventional collar and made of conventional shirt fabric in a plain, checked or striped style. Worn tucked in.

School tie (purchased from the school shop in person or via <http://www.millfieldshop.com/>).

Option B: Senior (L6 and U6)

Suit: Trouser or skirt suit (black, dark grey or dark blue; feint pin stripe or very subtle check permitted). No leather or shiny fabric. Trousers must be straight legged (not skin tight or leggings style), full length with a visible vertical crease. Skirt hemlines must fall between knee and mid-calf. A split at the back of the skirt is permitted but must be of no more than 5cm.

Optional waistcoat – plain or to match suit.

Blouse: A formal full sleeved blouse of conventional collar and fabric in a plain, checked or striped style. Worn tucked in. No beading, lace or other embellishments. Ties are not to be worn with a blouse.

For all sixth formers

Plain, dark coloured, V necked or round necked jumper i.e. black, grey, navy blue. No cardigans, half zip jumpers or sweatshirts allowed. Jumpers must be suitable for wearing under a suit jacket, the bottom of the jumper must not hang below the jacket length.

Socks/ tights: white socks if worn with skirt. Dark blue, black, grey or flesh coloured tights. Plain dark socks with trouser suit.

Shoes: plain, smart, flat black or brown polishable shoes. No suede or canvas. No trainers or boots.

Coats: plain, dark colour. The hem to reach below suit jacket length. No gilets and no embellishments e.g. fur trim, beading etc.

Jewellery: no more than two necklaces, two bracelets, two rings and two earrings (in each ear) to be worn at once, no highly conspicuous earrings e.g. large hoops. No other piercings or any tattoos allowed. No visible ankle bracelets.

Hair: must be neat and tidy and not impair vision. Hair, if dyed, should be of a natural hair colour only.

Formal Dress: white shirt and school tie or white blouse (without a tie) for formal occasions e.g. Headmaster's Assembly, Wells Cathedral Service, away matches

N.B. minimal makeup is permitted; no lipstick or nail varnish allowed. For occasions where games kit is appropriate, regulation school sports kit must be worn.
