CONSERVATION AND ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, MAY 24, 2021 VIRTUAL MEETING

1. Call to Order and Attendance – 7:03 P.M.

2. Old Business

Approval of minutes from March 29 – motioned by Newton, seconded by Daly Approval of minutes from February 22 – motioned by Macunas, seconded by Daly

3. New Business

• Presentation from West Hartford students and residents regarding a Climate Emergency Resolution proposal

The Commission was joined by resident Henry Miller and by local students Corina Chang, Arlo Tucker, Evan Piccioli, and Zoe Weissman. The group summarized their experiences in town and their enjoyment of its environmental qualities. They proceeded into their rationale for advancing a Climate Emergency Resolution proposal, and then described the proposal itself whose current draft contemplates 1) Climate Commission formation with voting and youth representation; 2) upward political pressure; 3) support of the Clean Energy Commission's energy plan targeting 100% clean energy by 2050; and 4) an endorsement of national carbon pricing policy. The group asked the Commission for its feedback, and plans to put the draft under community and economic development review, and then the same with Town Council. The Commission agreed to hold a June meeting that will include review of the resolution draft and/or determination on formal feedback.

• UConn property updates

Mr. Daly summarized concerns from residents in the neighborhood of the former UConn property now owned by Ideanomics, inquiring as to the property's role in facilitating rodent activity given its unmaintained characteristic. Mr. Macunas read recent feedback received from Town Manager Hart on the matter, including his communications with Ideanomics and the Town's and Health District's recourse under the property maintenance code. The Commission agreed to continue placing attention on this issue on behalf of area residents, and to make a second inquiry to the Town on 1) whether the health district could perform another investigation; 2) whether the property's pond might harbor rodent food sources; and 3) whether the Commission could gain firsthand knowledge of property plans once a new owner is identified.
