Centaurus hosted their home Track invitational last weekend. Thirty teams attended the meet.

For the third week in a row, Maggie McCleskey broke a Centaurus Track school record. Maggie ran 5:03.37 in the 1600m to break her own 1-weekold school record by 9 seconds. She took first place in the 1600m race by a little less than a second, outkicking the second place finisher on the final lap.

Senior James Overberg was 2nd in the 1600m running an impressive 4:22.59, closing his last lap in 60 seconds

Senior Kai Smith won the boys 3200m in a personal record of 9:45.15.

The boys 4x400m of Jack Carlson, Kyle Berg, Tyrese McClinton-EL and Jacoby Ennis took home the win in 3:31.96

CENTAURUS 1:WEB - STUDENT CHROMEBOOK REPAIR - SUMMER 2021



If your district-issued Chromebook needs repair, you have the opportunity to have it repaired before returning to school in August! It is highly recommended that you arrange for repairs during the summer to avoid repair delays in the fall and so that your Chromebook is ready when you start classes.

All Chromebook repairs between May 20 and July 30 will be completed through the BVSD IT Service Desk. Students/families should call the IT Service Desk at 720-561-4357. The IT Service Desk can troubleshoot and resolve many issues over the phone. If they are unable to resolve the issue over the phone, they will instruct you to drop off your Chromebook at the IT Service Desk for repair and provide information about how to pick up the repaired device. The BVSD IT Service Desk is located at 6600 Arapahoe Road, Boulder (see this document for office location).

Regular Office Hours (for Spring through May 28 and for Fall beginning July 26): Monday-Friday, 7:00am-4:30pm Summer Office Hours (June 1 - July 22): Monday-Thursday, 7:00am-5:00pm Note: IT Offices are closed on Fridays during the Summer, and closed on Monday, May 31, and Monday, July 5.

Payment: Note that most repairs do not incur fees. Repair fees cover the cost of replacement parts. Students are required to pay the repair fee, if any, prior to picking up your Chromebook. Please check your RevTrak account to review and pay your fine.
