Welcome by Jenny Pitt. Jenny introduced Jay Welk, CTE Director for Davis School District.

- Mr. Welk introduced himself and explained that he is here to presentation on Personalized Competency Based Learning.

- When you graduate, what skills or knowledge do you have to take with you to college? Can you apply that to the real world.

- When they graduate from Viewmont High School, what skills do students have to reach their potential on:

 - Collaborate with others
 - Problem Solving
 - Timeliness
 - Student leadership – or a club

- Mr. Welk has talked about changing how we do the Citizenship grade.
- Malissa Wolfer spoke on the importance of the summation of students' learning experiences in the school.

- Mr. Welk spoke for a moment on the new building of the CTE Tech Catalyst Center – called a Magnet High School, not a comprehensive high school. Some of the programs offered will be Pharm Tech, Medical Assisting, Epic Games... There will be a video production room, audio production room. There will be a program for Unmanned Aerial systems... Weber State University has asked to partner with us, as well as Hill Air Force Base. The building is on 3.5 acres, so there is room for expansion. They will also offer culinary arts, and restaurant, catering for events can be held there.

Jenny Pitt thanked Mr. Welk for his presentation.

Jenny reminded us that at our last meeting, we voted on the proposals and that at today's meeting, we said we would open it up to amendments – Malissa Wolfer explained that every single proposal at the last meeting had ended up being funded through other venues, including those for the performing arts. Therefore, there would not be a need for amendments.

Jenny asked for any additional comments. Malissa said that with the current budget we will have about a 6% carryover, which might give us a comfortable margin for changing prices in some of the items.

Since we already voted, we do not need to vote.

Jason asked for a couple of minutes, announcing that he would be leaving Viewmont for Northridge High School next year. He said that he is looking forward to the challenges ahead for him at Northridge, but he is sad to leave VHS.

Jenny asked for any other business, and there was none. The next meeting will be on April 21. It will not be necessary to have a meeting in May, so that meeting will be cancelled. Chad Bowles motioned to adjourn the meeting, and it was seconded by Lisa Cook. Meeting was adjourned.
