
### Maret School - Rising 3rd Grade Summer Reading 2021

Summer is an opportunity for students of all ages to enjoy reading in a relaxed and leisurely setting. Summer reading is also a vital way that students keep their skills sharp for the upcoming school year. Maret recommends that students spend at least 20 minutes reading each day during the summer. Students should select books and other reading material that interest and challenge them, and families should consider ways that they can read together or make discussing books a part of their lives over the summer months. We recognize that there is a range of readers at each grade level. If books on this list do not match your child's reading ability, you may choose to read them aloud to your child. \*Big Foot and Little Foot series by Ellen Potter: Hugo is a young Sasquatch who longs for adventure. Boone is a young boy who longs to see a Sasquatch. When their worlds collide, they become the unlikeliest pair of best friends.



Sadiq series by Siman Nuurali: Sadiq has many interests, from soccer to video games to cooking (and eating!) samosas. In each book, Sadiq shares a new hobby with friends and neighbors.

\*The Water Princess by Susan Verde: The story of one young girl's quest to bring clean drinking water to her African village.






\*Just Ask!: Be Different, Be Brave, Be You by Sonia Sotomayor: A story in which friends who have different abilities, work together to build a community garden.


## Maret School – Rising 3rd Grade Summer Reading 2021


\*Bailey School Kids series by Debbie Dadey: The Bailey school kids are always investigating strange people and events that take place in their town.

deeds.




\*Arnie the Doughnut series by

pet "the talking doughnut."





her a better life.



\*Mia Mayhem series by Kara West: Meet Mia Macarooney, an ordinary eight-year-old who finds out she has an extraordinary super-secret.


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


**Lucy** by Randy Cecil: A tiny dog, a kindhearted girl, and a nervous juggler converge in a cinematic book in four acts.
