are 5th & the Cavs are 14th in the Eastern Conference. The Lakers are at a 3 loss streak and Warriors are at a 1 loss streak.

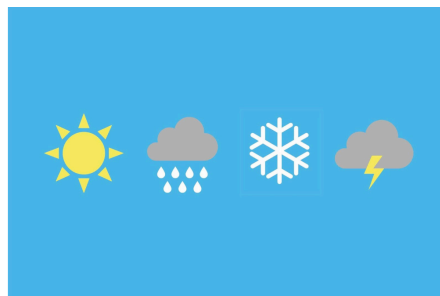
Good job to the boys soccer for playing strong. Girls soccer is killing it with 3-1 in the league. Track and field starts real soon so good luck to everyone who tries out.

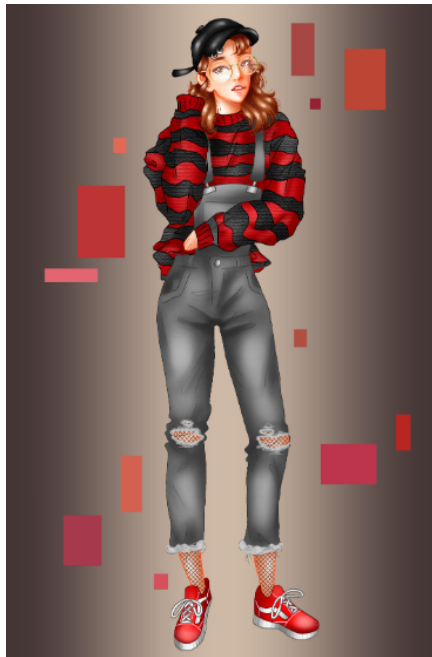
