

2nd Grade Summer Homework Directions

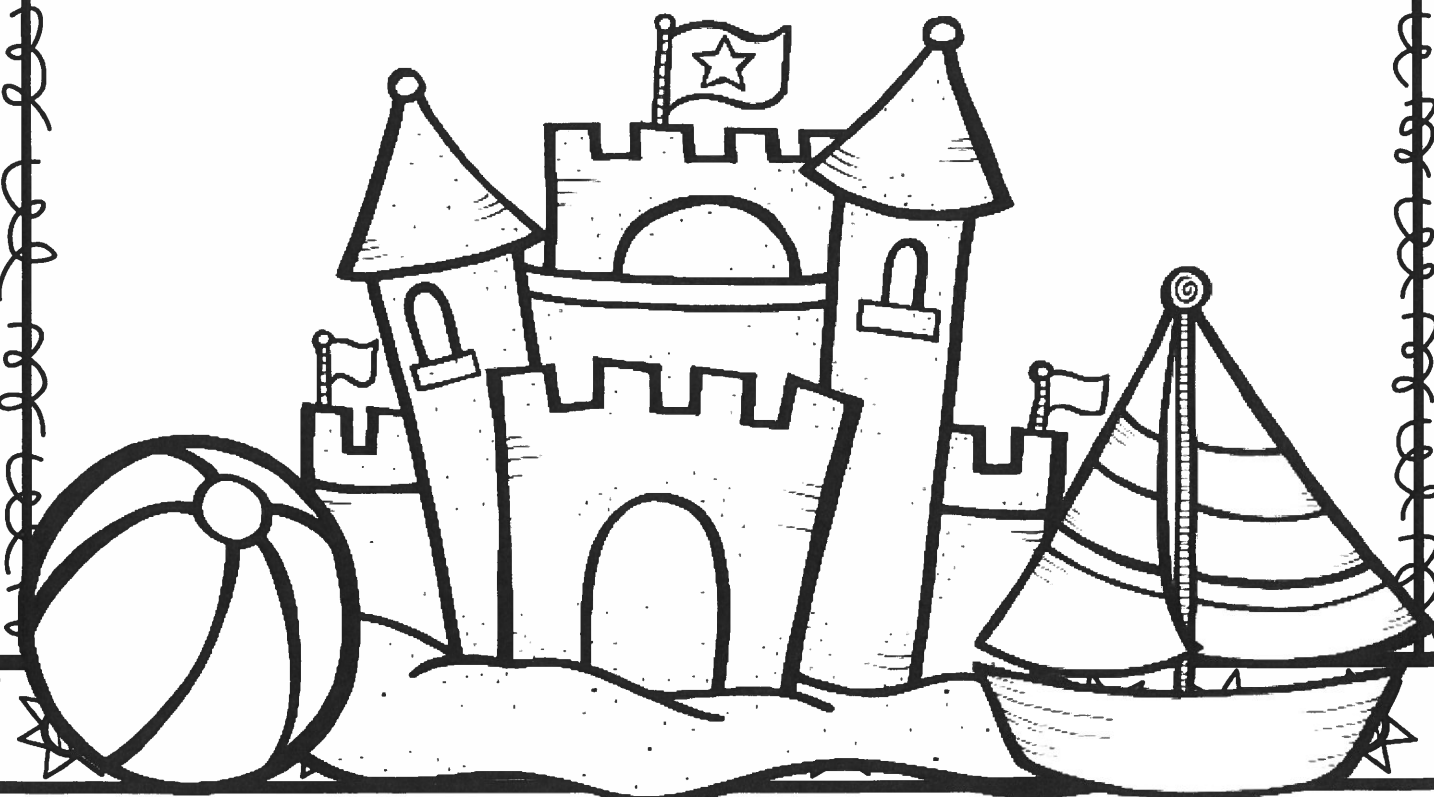

- Part 2-Math: I would love to see you make flash cards for addition and subtraction facts to 10. Practice these all summer so you are fluent in addition and subtraction facts 0-10! *If you have your Moby Max log in still, you can log in and practice math fact fluency there too!*
- Part 3- Reading: Complete the June, July, and August Summer Reading menu boards! Mark each spot as you complete it! Turn these in on the first day of 2nd grade!

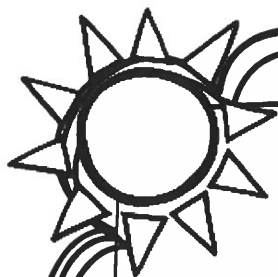

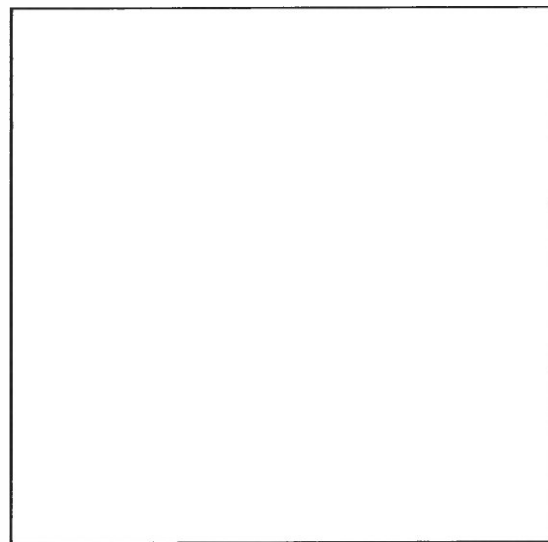




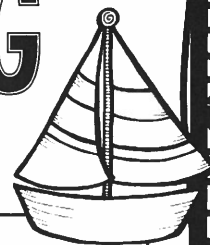
JOURNAL WRITING IDEAS

- What do you like to eat?

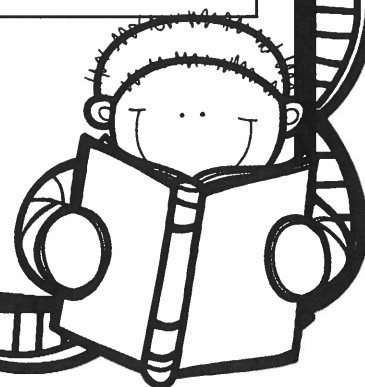
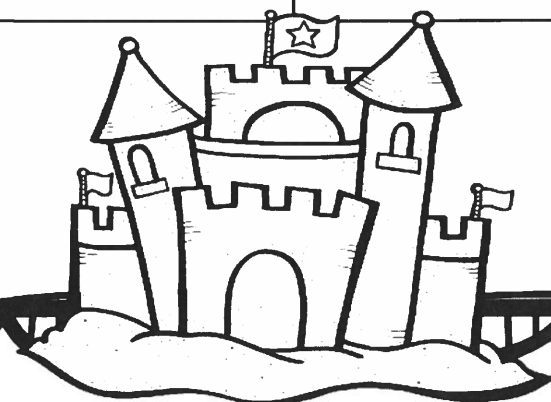

Book Report in a Bag Summer Reading Project

Reports in a Bag are a fun, creative, and interactive way to share what you've learned from your Summer reading. If you don't normally have large paper grocery bags, please make sure to pick one up the next time you head to the store so that you are ready for this project.

Be sure to plan appropriately, and not wait until the week before school starts to read the book. Remember that you will need time to work on the project!

Book Report in a Bag – Project Directions

1. Remember to make sure you have a large paper grocery/gift bag.
2. Choose one of the books and read it!
3. The front of the bag should be decorated with the **book title** and the **author's name**. You also need to **draw and color a scene from the story**. Your scene may be drawn on a piece of unlined paper and then glued onto the bag. Be creative! For example, you could glue fake plant leaves onto the front of your bag, if your book is set in nature. Just be sure that any fun extra details are **related to your book** and **make your bag look great!**
4. On the **back** of the bag, write a **summary of the book**. The summary should tell about the **main characters, setting, and a brief explanation about what happened at the beginning, middle, and end of the story**. Write your summary (**at least 5 sentences**) on lined paper and then glue or staple it to the bag. The summary should be completed in paragraph form.

I cannot wait to see what you come up with! We will present these in class for a grade the first couple of weeks of school! I cannot wait for the best year with you!!!! 😊
