<u>Required</u> - All students should arrive on the first day of school having read their required summer reading for their rising grade levels. We love the combination of an all-grade read and a book of choice from the extensive and thoughtfully curated list. See the letter below from our English Department Chair, Annalee Taylor.

<u>Required</u> - All students should arrive on the first day of school with their completed relationship component project outlined within the summer reading document. These projects are a wonderful way for all students to get to know one another more deeply, and they are meant to be easy to complete. If it is causing stress or feeling too complicated, it probably is--this should be enjoyable, simple, and fun!

<u>Optional</u> - Within the summer reading materials, there are links for grammar, keyboarding, and writing to use as desired by students and families. We are including these because it can be a great way to keep kids engaged in these important skills.

<u>Optional</u> - Each year, we issue a summer "charge" to students with a mini contest. This year, Mr. Northrup has created a padlet <u>here</u> where students can add interesting photos and notes about what they are up to! We are encouraging them to share acts of kindness, stories shared by older members of their families, and books they have read, just to name a few things. There are always prizes in August based on participation! (Remember, to list <u>all</u> of the books you have read in order to qualify for my additional prizes!!!)

As always, we will update you throughout the summer with various "need to know" items. The next letter typically comes in early July, so I'll leave your inbox alone for a month or so!

We are recommending grammar, reading, writing, and keyboarding practice this summer.
