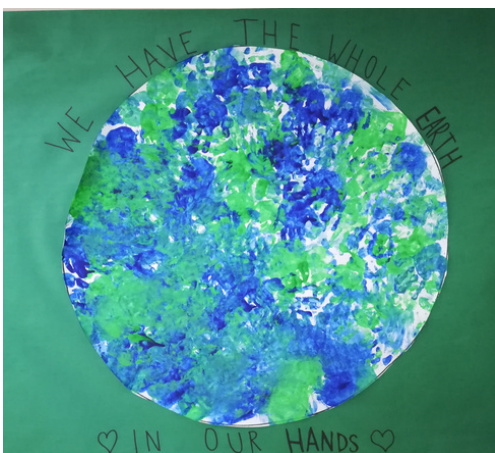




4YO Class

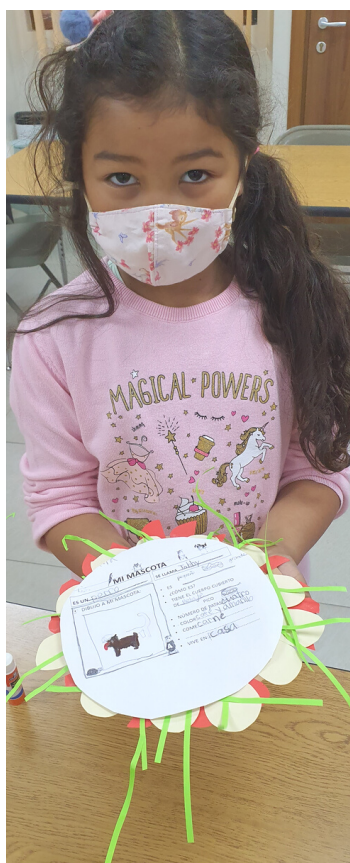
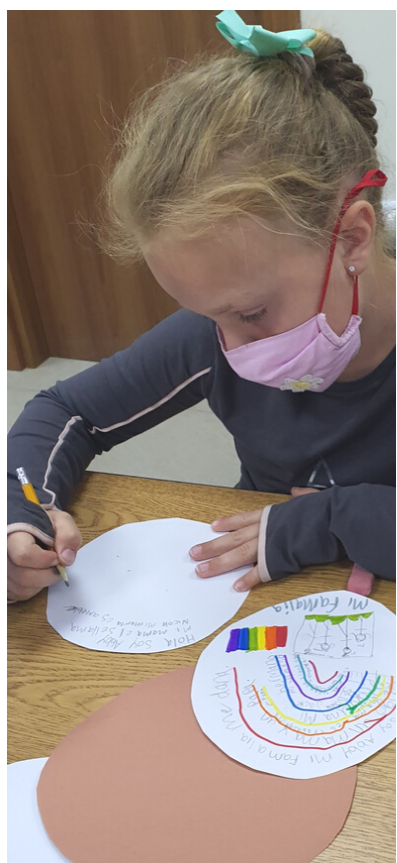




Spanish

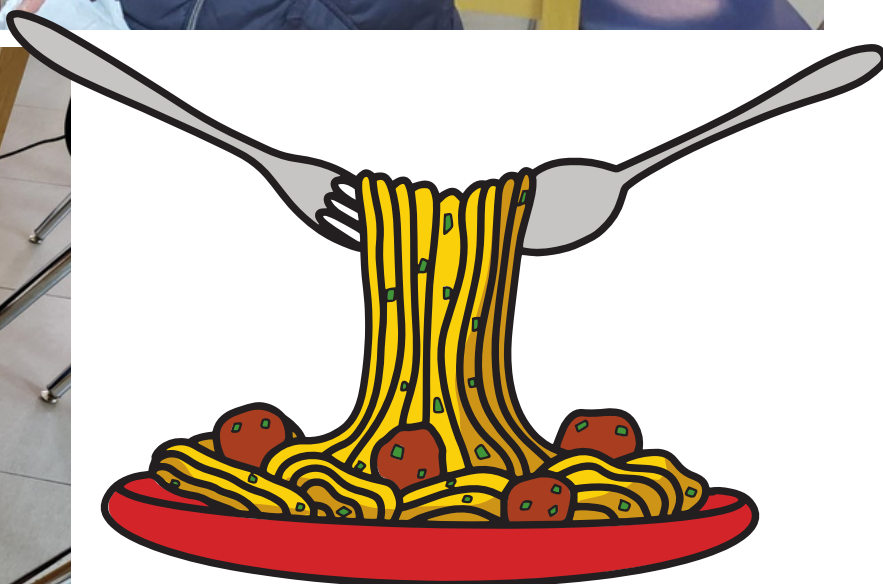


Engineering with food

Tasty discovery

The 11-year-olds have the opportunity to apply the engineering concepts they have learned to building spaghetti bridges using spaghetti, hot glue guns and a few additional materials. After researching Roman bridges, modern-day bridges and the engineering that enables them to support large amounts of weight, students proceeded to design and build their own bridge. The bridge that holds the most weight wins a prize.

Some students chose to research earthquake resistant structures. They researched different strategies to enable buildings to withstand an earthquake and how scientists test their ideas. These students will then build a 'shake table' and test two different buildings' ability to withstand an 'earthquake'.

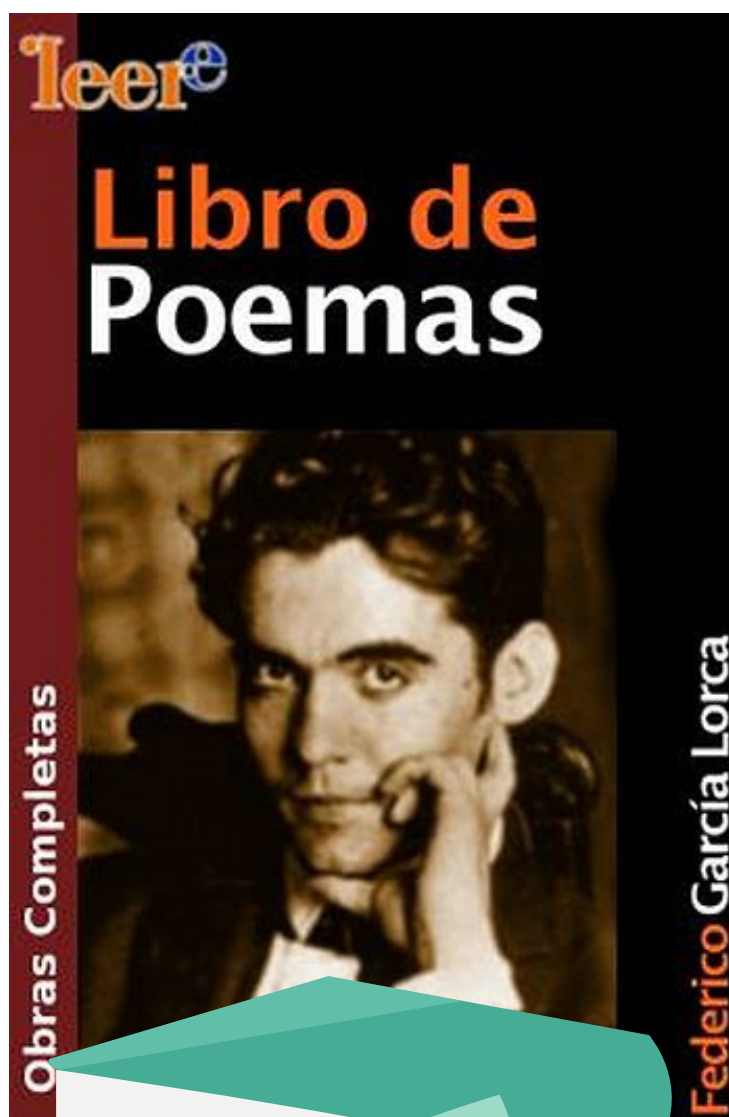
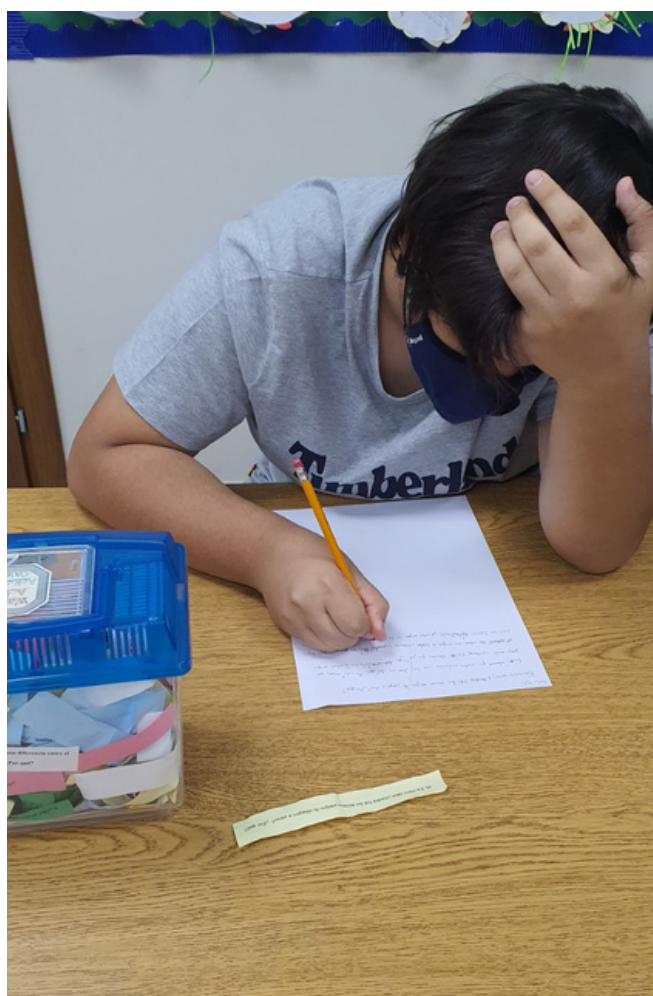
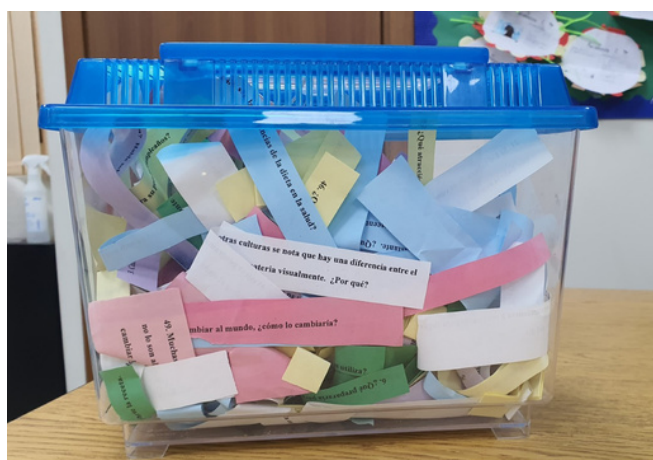




Spanish

Analyzing poetry

The Spanish 4 class has been using "Calentamientos", or warmup questions, to practice their improvisational speaking and writing skills. The students have been engaged in timed writing practices ranging across various topics, such as friendship, the future, science and technology, and so on. They are currently analyzing and assessing the poetry of Federico Garcia Lorca and his impact on Spanish literature. Their most recent assignment was to research the literary group "Generacion de 27" and discuss their importance on the creative world of Spain. It was interesting to travel to different parts of Spain and Spanish history through the eyes of different poets.

Thoughts from Ms. Irida

Dear Teachers and Parents,

Summer is approaching, and every school holiday is an opportunity to celebrate 'holiday reading'.

We are pleased to announce the annual TIS Summer Reading Challenge. This year's theme is **"Dive Into Reading!"**

The TIS Summer Reading Challenge is about reading for the pleasure of reading. The aim would be to build positive attitudes to reading and to continue to build the students' enjoyment, confidence and reading achievement.

How will the Summer Reading Challenge work this year?

This year we want our students to set their own goals. Of course, a challenge isn't a challenge unless students are working toward something.....challenging.

Students should keep in mind their goals for this challenge. They should set their own goals and work toward meeting them. They are just competing with themselves.

What might be some possible challenges:

- If a student read 4 books last year, reading 6 this year would be a challenge.
- If a student is reading just fantasy, the challenge might be to read a biography.
- If a student is reading short books, the challenge might be to read long books.
- If a student is reading contemporary texts, the challenge might be to read classic literature.

We want our students to make this challenge a fun adventure rather than a chore. Therefore, it's important students get to choose what they read with the focus on relaxation and enjoyment.

Participation is voluntary and open to students age 5 through secondary level. Students can read whatever they enjoy - fiction, fact books, poetry, joke books, picture books, eBooks, audiobooks - just as long as they get to choose what they want to read.

Students who return their summer reading log by September 15th and meet their reading challenge will receive a prize in the fall. You may download the reading log [here](#).

NOTE: To complete this challenge, we would like students to take a photo reading their book somewhere unusual over the summer holidays. We want to see as many wacky ideas as possible. Then send your photos to irida-shehu@tirana.qsi.org - they will be displayed during the prize-winning ceremony and on the library bulletin board. The aim is to showcase children as reading role models.
