## Term 6:

Our focus for this term is 'Helping Heroes'. We will be reading the stories 'Superworm', 'Supertato', looking at non-fiction books about people who help us and for some of the older children we will be talking about starting school. We will also be learning words, concepts and songs related to the stories. This will help us in our play as we learn, explore and practise using these new words.

## **Understanding of the World:**

This term we will be continuing to look after our gardening patch and watching our fruit and vegetables grow! We will hopefully be picking and eating our strawberries, beans and tomatoes soon! We will also be having a very exciting visit from the police, we will be able to ask questions to find out more about how they help our community.

## **Our Maths Focus:**

#### Welcome Back!

#### Packed Lunches:
