Go back to normal or moving forward

In Luke's gospel, Jesus has one journey and that is to Jerusalem. Luke states that Jesus set his face to Jerusalem and did not look back (9:51). St. Francis de Sales describes each new day as a newly fallen snowstorm: pure, undefiled, and unmarked. It waits for us to place our mark on it.

As we move through the pandemic and witness the lessening of Covid restrictions, I ask us to reflect on the title of this musing.
