

2ND GRADE NEWS

During these last few weeks in social studies, we will focus on the how the Colonists gained their independence from England. We will play a taxation game using Smarties candies to represent how the Colonists were taxed on everything, resulting in the beginning of the Revolutionary War. In math, we are working on positive and negative ordered pairs and using the coordinate grid to create summertime pictures. We will conclude with looking at numerous data collections and ways to represent data taken from student created surveys. Other exciting projects will include an in-class partner state project. Students will be given a travel budget and will enjoy a fun project by selecting a state of their choice to research and travel through. Students will also create a Google Slide biography presentation of the historical character they represented during our American Revolution Walk Through. We will enjoy all of the exciting findings in a presentation to classmates.

1ST GRADE NEWS

Our firsties continue to IMPRESS us with their increasing technology skills and the growth they have made during this year.

We have been finishing up on our Wonders Unit: Together We Can, which includes: How Can You Work Together to Make our Lives Better, Who Helps You, How Can Weather Affect Us, What Traditions Do You Know About and Why Do We Celebrate Holidays.

As we completed our Social Studies Unit about American Symbols, the students wrote an opinion writing about their favorite American Symbol.

We have just completed our Topic 14 Unit: Using Data to answer questions. We will be moving into our next unit geometry. The students will learn about plane shapes and solid figures. They will also be introduced to flat surfaces, sides, and vertices. They continue to practice their math skills using iReady, XtraMath and Prodigy.

First graders continue to take Reading Counts tests to strengthen their reading comprehension

skill. Mrs. McCausland makes a weekly appearance in our first grade classes to read stories to the first graders. She has been teaching the students about the life cycle of a butterfly by giving live weekly updates on the development of the caterpillars she has brought into the school. The kids have been able to see the tiny caterpillars eating the milkweed plants, the caterpillar making the “J” shape and even saw a video of the pupa wiggling out of its skin before it creates its chrysalis.




We continue to exercise our hearts with Coach Joel two times a week. The students have been doing a great job participating.

4TH GRADE NEWS

There was a lot of learning going on this year. To just name a few highlights...in social studies, students learned about California history including the Missions and the California Gold Rush. In math students were introduced to two digit by two digit multiplication and long division. In science, a couple things they learned about were volcanoes and how the eye works. In reading, they were exposed to 3 novels, The BFG, The Island of the Blue Dolphins, and By the Great Horn Spoon, on



top of our regular curriculum. The novels helped to connect the kids to our units in history/social studies.
