Dear Rising Senior Family,

It is exciting to consider that your students are seniors! On behalf of the 2022 King Yearbook Publications team, I would like to notify you to plan for your student's Senior portrait. **It will be due shortly after the start of school, so summer is the optimum time to get these items ready.** Seniors with younger siblings at King may also wish to take their Senior Sibling photograph over the summer.

Your student's **Senior Portrait** and **quotations** are due Monday, **September 20**. **Please have the Portrait taken by a family member, friend, or a professional photographer by 8/27 to meet this deadline, and you are encouraged to submit the Portrait earlier, over the summer.** If you would like a professional photographer to take your student's portrait, we have a list of other photographers used by King families included in this packet.

Specifications for the portrait:

It must be in a vertical orientation

It must fit 8 1/2" x 11" format

It must be high resolution

- Use a camera (not a phone)
- Shoot in a large file format or RAW
- Resolution must be 300ppi

Keep the background simple for the quotations

Allow a good margin above the student's head

Attire should be appropriate for a wide-ranging audience

Specifications for the senior quotations: If students wish to include quotations in their portrait, please include in our [Google Form](#) (which will be emailed) by September 20th.
