Maths

This week in Maths we will begin to think about multiplication. We will start by revisiting counting in 10's and will then begin to think about putting objects into groups and how to count them by counting each group rather than individual objects.

English

This week we will begin to start our learning on our new key text 'The Bee who Spoke'. We will start by thinking about who the character is in the story and where the story might be set. We will then write a character description for Belle.

Learning Journey:

This week in Science we will begin to explore animals. We will be thinking about the different groups that animals can be placed into.

Sounds Write

This week we will continue looking at the extended code.
We will begin to explore the /air/ sound and the different ways to spell the sound; air, ear, are, ere, eir, ayor and ayer.

Please could you practice the following words based on our phonics this week. Look at the spellings with the 'air' sound (air, ear, are, ere, eir, ayor and ayer).
