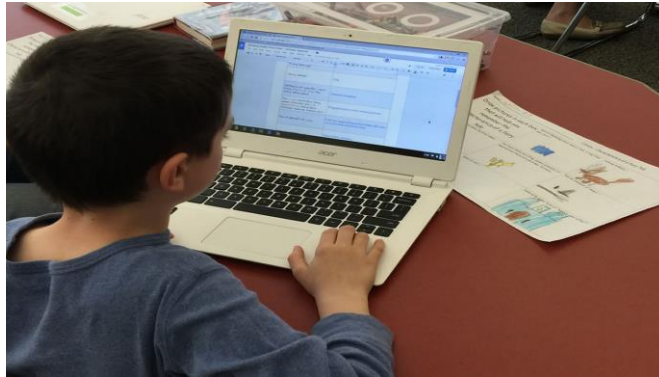

# Timeline for Spring 2016 Pilot

**January** - Establish Pilot group of teachers (Grade 4-7 teachers, administrators)

**February - June** - Pilot group meets weekly

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**April - May:** LMS meets with students to teach 1:1 Course related to digital citizenship.

**May 3, 2016:** Parent Meeting for students participating in 1:1 Pilot

**Week of May 9, 2016:** Students get devices! Pilot begins

**May-June:** Observations gathered

**June 10, 2016:** Student devices collected; Parent feedback gathered

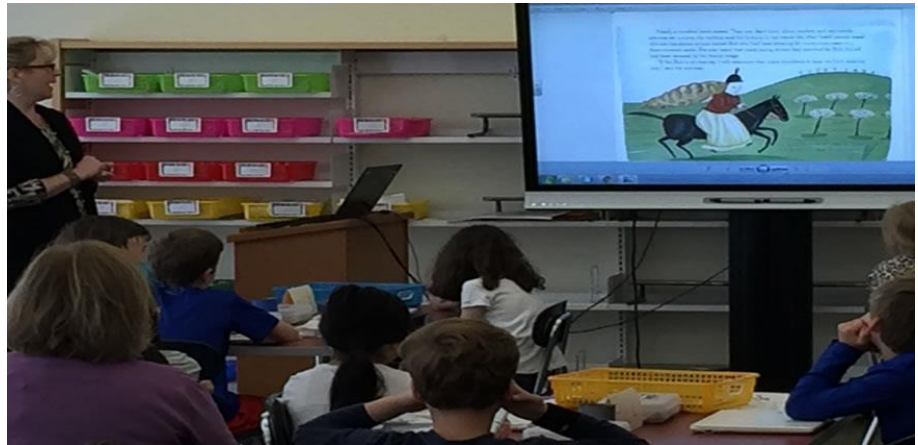

Home-School Paperwork/Partnership: Loan agreement

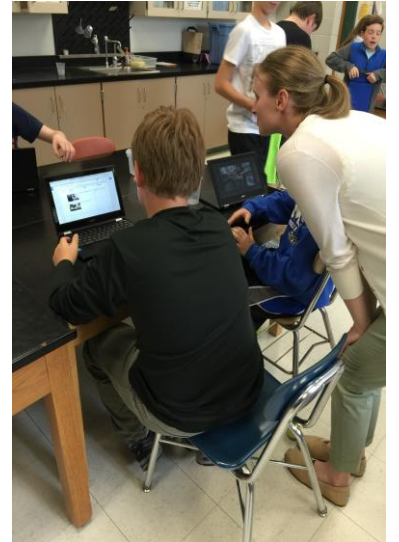
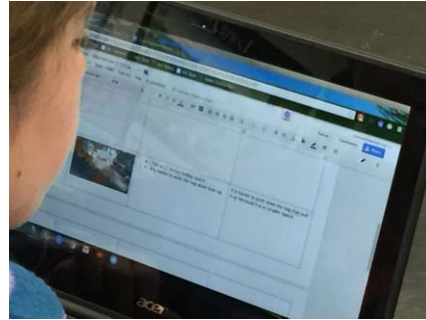
Home-School Communication: teacher website and email; Google Classroom

**On May 9, 2016, we launched in all 9 Pilot classrooms**

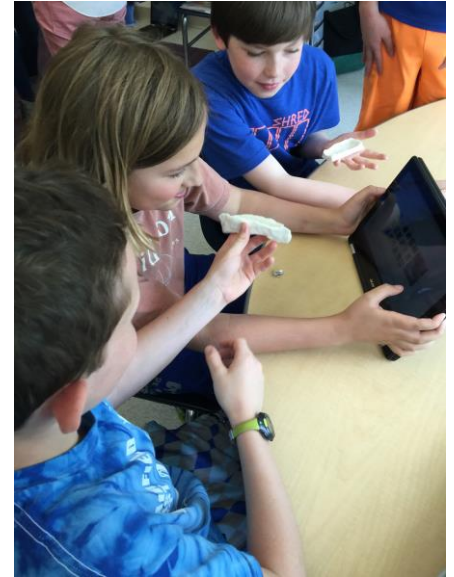
# How's It Going?
