SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY: THE DOS PUEBLOS CHARGERS

Nestled between the mountains and the sea, west of Santa Barbara, Dos Pueblos High School was established in the Goleta Valley in 1966 and serves a diverse population of over 2,000 students in grades 9-12. The ethnic makeup of the student body is 46% Hispanic, 41% White, 7% Asian, 2% African American and 4% other. Approximately 38% of our students are identified as socioeconomically disadvantaged.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

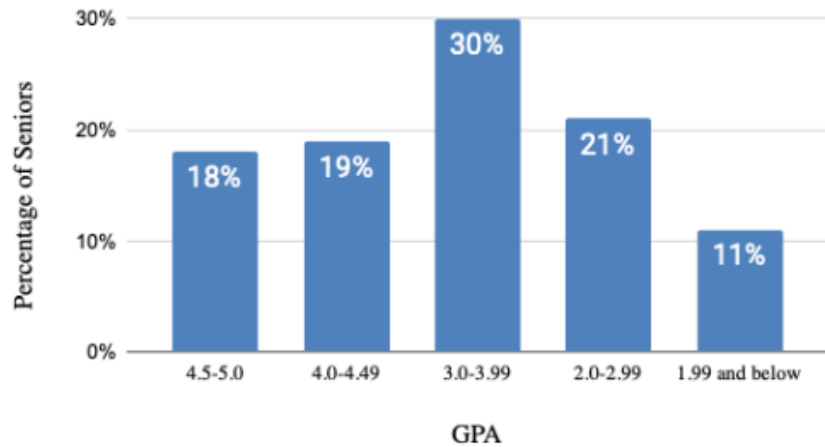
Dos Pueblos High School graduates are required to earn a minimum of 220 credits, five for each semester class passed with a "D-" or better. These include:

- 4 years English
- 3 years Mathematics (including Common Core Math 2 or higher)
- 3 years Social Science
- 2 years Science
- 2 years Physical Education
- 1 year World Language or Visual/Performing Arts
- 2 years Additional College Preparatory Coursework or Career Technical Education
- 1 semester Health
- 4.5 years Electives

GRADING SYSTEM AND CLASS RANK:

GPA is computed both weighted and non-weighted. Grade point averages are computed on a four (4) point scale: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. Santa Barbara Unified School District does not rank.

AP/IB EXAM RESULTS:

For the 2019-20 school year:

448 students took a total of 731 AP exams

From those AP exams in 25 subjects tested, 77% passed with a 3 or higher.

90 students took a total of 164 IB exams

From those IB exams in 12 subjects tested, 85% passed with a 4 or higher.

CURRICULUM:

A varied curriculum of academic and elective courses is available for students. Dos Pueblos offers 20 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. AP and IB are open enrollment programs, and students are not limited in the number of AP/IB/SBCC courses that they take.

We also offer 18 International Baccalaureate (IB) courses: English Literature SL & HL, History of the Americas SL & HL, Math Applications & Interpretations SL & HL, Math Analysis & Approaches SL & HL, Film SL & HL, Biology SL, Environmental Systems & Societies SL, Visual Art SL & HL, Spanish SL & HL, French SL & HL, Theory of Knowledge, Economics SL & HL. Environmental Systems was not offered this year.

We offer 13 Honors classes in English, Mathematics, Chemistry and the DP Engineering Academy (DPEA). SBCC Dual Enrollment courses are also offered on the DP campus. These include Math 117 (Statistics), Math 150/160 (Calculus with Analytic Geometry), English 110/111 (Composition & Reading) and Economics 101/102 (Micro and Macroeconomics). We also have over 10 Dual Enrollment classes in Media including Photo 109, Film Production 114/160/165, Graphic Design GDP110/111 and Media Arts & Technology MAT 105/112/131 where students can become industry certified in media production, as well as courses receiving credit in Construction Technology (CT 114/115).

Our internationally recognized Dos Pueblos Engineering Academy (DPEA) consists of over 100 students per grade level, approximately 400 students total in this four year program which culminates in a capstone project in the senior year. The DPEA provides highly motivated students with varying interests the opportunity to participate in a collaborative, project-based, rigorous curriculum.

We consider AP, IB and SBCC Dual Enrollment courses to be equally rigorous, although Math 150/160 Calculus classes are the highest level of math offered at DP. We have roughly 100 Engineering Academy and 15 International Baccalaureate Diploma candidates graduate each year.

COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS:

Our class of 2020 enrolled in institutions of higher learning as follows:

4 Yr College	34%

Because our local community college, Santa Barbara City College, now offers its SBCC Promise program (which provides two years of free tuition, books and required materials), we have had an increased number of students opting for SBCC as their post-secondary option.

*Our 2 year college numbers increased 18% over the class of 2019, which might be due to Covid and online instruction at the 4yr colleges.

COVID 19 RESPONSE:

In April 2019, due to the school system transitioning to online learning, our Santa Barbara Unified School District School Board voted to give all students an option for their Spring 2020 Semester grades. For each class, our students had the option of requesting to receive a traditional letter grade or CR/NC.

For 2020-21, we have transitioned to a Block Schedule format (3 courses required, and up to 4 courses possible in the Fall and 3 courses required with up to 4 courses possible in the Spring).

Fall 2020 courses will be conducted online. Our community service requirement (60 hours) was suspended for this year's seniors.
