Deafverse is a choose-your-own-adventure game created just for teenagers. The students get to make their own choices, stand up for themselves, and build confidence and skills they can use in real life.





- Take pictures doing the activities.


## **A Language Experience Book**

## Why is 20 Minutes of Reading a Day Important?


