STRONGSVILLE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING MARCH 1, 2018 REGULAR MEETING – WORK SESSION

The Regular Meeting of the Strongsville Board of Education Work Session and any other items germane to the Board of Education was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 1, 2018, at the **Administration Building, Meeting Room, 18199 Cook Avenue, Strongsville, Ohio**, by President, Carl W. Naso.

All members of the Board and media were notified of this meeting in compliance with Section 121.22 O.R.C., effective November 28, 1975.

The following Board Members answered Roll Call: Colonel Evans, Mr. Grozan, Mrs. Ludwig, Mr. Micko, and Mr. Naso.

Others present were: Mr. Cameron Ryba, Superintendent; Mr. George Anagnostou, Treasurer; and Ms. Jenni Pelko, Assistant Superintendent

DISTRICT GOALS

The Board has three stated goals; Student Achievement and Growth, Financial Prudence, and Community Engagement. All decisions made at Board Meetings support these three goals.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. TIMELY INFORMATION

*1. School Calendars for 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 School Years

Resolution 18-03-01

Be it resolved upon the recommendation of the Superintendent that the School Calendars for the 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 school years be adopted as presented.

All traditional timelines for prom, last day of school, etc. for Senior Students are in place.

2. Discussion Item – Financial Prudence

Focus for the March work session meeting was financial prudence. Mr. Anagnostou shared an update on the Five-Year Forecast and what it means moving forward. He shared an extensive list of District cost savings efforts – past, present, and future. Expenses through the forecast will increase due to inflation and an increase in costs such as salary increases and healthcare costs. These expenses are offset by the reductions made over the years. The updated forecast shows the District will begin deficit spending in FY19 instead of FY18.

2. <u>Discussion Item – Financial Prudence</u> (continued)

Regarding the 2020 Plan, Mr. Anagnostou reviewed the third Action Step under the Financial Prudence objective to maintain financial management practices and a culture of budget consciousness that ensures focused spending. The third action step is to develop a cost reduction plan and levy implementation plan should components of the established evaluation criteria not be met. Mr. Anagnostou reviewed the Evaluation Criteria, the first being Assess "true cash days" of the district with a target of 60 days or more. In December of 2020, the District is projected to dip below the 60 days cash reserve benchmark for the first time. It will go back up in February, 2021 with the receipt of tax money. We will dip below the benchmark again in December, 2021. Receipt of tax money will bump us back up again, but the projection is that FY2022 will end in a deficit. By law, school districts cannot end the year with a deficit. Mr. Anagnostou continued explaining the evaluation criteria.

- Assess "true cash days" of the district with at target of 60 days or more. *Currently projecting to dip below this point in December 2020.*
- Maintain an annual unreserved general fund balance between 5%-15% of the general fund operating revenue. FY18: 32.8%; FY19: 27.8%; FY20: 19.4%; FY21: 8.3%; FY22: 6.1%
- Year-end expenditures will not exceed revenues. Expenditures will exceed revenues beginning in FY19 and moving forward.
- Five-Year Forecast will project fiscal stability for two years beyond current school year. *Current projection of deficit spending is not sustainable.*
- Overall per pupil expenditures will be compared to similar districts. For FY16, expenditure per pupil was \$12,785 which is comparable to similar districts.

The District has been and continues to be fiscally responsible and good stewards of the taxpayers' money. The elimination of over \$4 million from State funding is the reason for these projected deficits.

Mr. Anagnostou shared some revenue generating ideas; the first being a new operating levy. The last new operating levy passed in November, 2007, 6.5 mills, continuing, and generates about \$9.2 million. Previous to that was a 6.0 mill levy that passed originally in August, 2002, and was most recently renewed November, 2016, and generates about \$7.9 million. Since 2007, Strongsville City Schools has seen a reduction in State funding of \$8.6 million. Other revenue generating ideas are to increase full day kindergarten and preschool tuition, increase pay to participate fees, and/or add full open enrollment. If the District should decide to go out for a new levy, some things to discuss are when would it happen, how much would it be for, continuous vs renewal. Mr. Anagnostou shared a calendar of filing deadlines and dates to consider. Should the decision be to not go after new revenue, then cost reduction strategies would have to be formulated and implemented.

Mr. Ryba and the Administration would like to be proactive in regards to asking the community for new money. Based on Mr. Anagnostou's work and discussion at the Finance Committee meeting, Mr. Ryba and Mr. Anagnostou should have an official recommendation to the Board as to when to go for a new operating levy along with its recommended millage in June.

Comments were made by the Board.
