Construction Update

Our construction and renovation projects continue to move forward on time and under budget. With the savings that we have realized throughout this project, we have been able to add features to the middle school, as well as expand the renovations to be completed at Strongsville High School. At the new Strongsville Middle School, the building is almost completely enclosed as the final windows and doors are being installed and interior finishes are ongoing. At Strongsville High School, we have completed renovations in the AP/Guidance office, auditorium, little theater, and the 100/300 wing. Renovation work has now moved into the music and athletic areas of the building.

Student Registration and Student Forms To Go Digital

The district has begun to work with InfoSnap, a leading company in online registration. As an additional benefit, InfoSnap is owned by PowerSchool, making it a single sign-on solution for our families. Starting with our March 2016 kindergarten registration, InfoSnap will be used for online registration of new students. For current students, all beginning of the year forms and other school forms will be pre-populated with the basic biographical information and completed electronically. This means no more paper shuffling; parents simply login to PowerSchool, click on the InfoSnap link, edit the information online, and submit. We are excited to add this solution to the district to improve the completion and accuracy of these necessary annual forms.

Strongsville Library Update

Just 4 U Student Friends Teen Group participated in a recent students rebuild challenge to help Syrian refugees. The group of 10 teens made 82 pinwheels as part of the challenge. For every pinwheel they made, the Bezos Family Foundation donates \$2 up to \$400,000 to the International Rescue Committee's Healing Classrooms program. The program helps Syrian children from conflict areas recover from crisis and grow into happy, healthy adults.
