# **Financial Update**

#### House and Senate Support Partial Restoration of TPP

Strongsville City Schools commends the Ohio Legislature for legislation that restores some of the State funding cut from Strongsville City Schools in the last budget. Recently, the House and Senate agreed upon a bill that provides \$44 million in Fiscal Year 2017 for schools negatively impacted by the loss of TPP reimbursement in the recent biennium budget.

Strongsville City Schools lost more than \$2.8 million in FY 2017 when Governor Kasich line-item vetoed a hold-harmless clause in the budget. The recent legislation, which Governor Kasich is expected to sign, restores approximately \$2.3 million in state funding to Strongsville, meaning the state funding loss is now approximately \$500,000 for FY 2017.

"We appreciate the legislature restoring a portion of state funding lost in the recent budget," said Superintendent Cameron M. Ryba. "Our District believed the cuts were unfair. I thank the Legislature for addressing the line-item veto that disproportionately affected districts like Strongsville. I also thank the Strongsville community for collectively voicing its opposition to the funding cuts with Sen. Patton and Rep. Dovilla. Our strong voice delivered a compelling message to Columbus. State funding is critical to our District as we plan for our future and continue to provide excellent educational opportunities for our students."
