### **Online Learning Tools**

In order to enhance our learning connection, **elementary students** have logins to access the following online tools both at home and in school:

<u>RAZ Kids</u>- Hundreds of interactive, leveled eBooks to make reading fun. With Raz-Kids, students can practice reading anytime, anywhere, and teachers can track progress along the way. The site also features motivational incentives and awards that students can earn.

<u>MobyMax</u>- A unique, individualized learning process for each student that allows them to work at their own level in Math, Science, and Reading. MobyMax is praised by students and teachers for its all-purpose solutions.

For our **middle level students**, teachers are using the following sites to support learning in their classrooms. Students should be accessing both at home on a regular basis:

Quia- This site provides study guides and practice tests to help students prepare for assessments, particularly in social studies, science and art.

<u>Achieve 3000</u>- This site is designed to help students with reading comprehension, vocabulary, and writing. Students are initially assessed and the program then provides articles to read

based on their reading level. The articles connect directly to what teachers are teaching in the classroom, reinforcing literacy throughout the curriculum.

# **Board Update**

At the September 3rd Board meeting, the Strongsville Schools Board of Education reviewed the Fiscal Year 2016 operating budget. Overall, the \$70.3 million dollar 2016 budget is slightly less than 2015. The Board of Education highlighted cost savings measure that allowed the District to adopt a flat budget despite increases in the cost of operations. Cost savings initiatives include:

- Reducing staffing by 20%, there are 186 fewer District positions than 2009;
- Moving from fully-insured to self-insured medical plans, saving \$1.8 million in 2015;
- Eliminating six buildings and repurposing space since 2010;
- Implementing Ohio Online Learning Program to keep students in the District, a projected savings of \$200,000.

The District is also controlling costs through comprehensive department spending reviews and the new Treasurer's thorough budgeting and reporting process. These efforts identified additional efficiencies and savings opportunities. It is important to note that the 2016 budget does not reflect recent state funding cuts, as those cuts will take effect next year. The recent state budget saw elimination of TPP funding leading to a cumulative loss of over \$6 million over three years.
