In order to allow time for the demolition of Center Middle School and the opening of our new Middle School in the summer of 2016, first through ninth grades will resume August 12. Tenth through twelfth grades and kindergarten will resume August 13 and preschool resumes August 17.

Students Earn Perfect Third Grade Reading Guarantee Results

For the second year in a row, 100% of Strongsville City School's third graders met the Ohio Third Grade Reading Guarantee criteria. The Third Grade Reading Guarantee is designed to ensure that every child receives the support needed to be reading at grade-level. Starting in kindergarten, students' reading levels are monitored. If a child's reading level falls below grade level, a reading improvement plan is immediately implemented. This perfect passage rate shows that the Strongsville City School District is preparing students for success and future learning.

Strongsville City School District Adds Two Master Teachers

Kelli Izzo, French teacher and, Vicki Kellar, Spanish teacher, earned their master teacher certifications from the State of Ohio. Kelli and Vicki are the fifth and sixth master teachers within the Strongsville City School District. Izzo has been teaching in Strongsville since 1999, and has taught at the middle school and high school levels. She is the World Languages department chair. Kellar has taught at the high school since 2004. The Master Teachers program is an optional program and the application process requires teachers to submit a 12 page portfolio of experiences within the last five years.

During the holiday, the following items are exempt from sales and use tax: clothing \$75 per item or less, school supplies \$20 per item or less, and school instructional materials \$20 per item or less. School Construction Updates

High School

At the high school, flooring is nearly complete in the 600 wing and the Media Center roof is underway. Electricians are continuing fire alarm work and the Bay windows have been replaced in the science classrooms. Other window replacement, demolition of ceilings, and final painting projects are all ongoing. Also, the auditorium demo has been completed. The next steps for the high school include the re-roofing, new flooring, and new ceiling tile installation of the 700/800 wing. The structural steel is being set at the new scene shop as part of the new auditorium.





Middle School

Painting of the gym is underway at the new Middle School. They are also working on foundations for the serpentine walls and plumbing in the locker room areas. The educational wing is rapidly progressing with bearing wall construction nearly complete and steel framing to follow. Interior walls and above ceiling rough-ins for the first and second floors continue. The third floor and roof decking will be completed by the end of September.
