# **District Leadership Changes**

**Cameron M. Ryba** is our new Superintendent as of July 1. Mr. Ryba has experience in all facets of K-12 education. Before coming to Strongsville, Ryba was a fourth grade teacher and later a High School Principal. Upon arrival at Strongsville in 2003, he was an Assistant Principal at Albion Middle School as well as Principal at both Muraski Elementary and Center Middle School. Most recently, Ryba was the Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources and Staff Development.

**Jennifer Pelko** is now the new Assistant Superintendent. Mrs. Pelko was previously the Principal of Center Middle School. Mrs. Pelko's primary role is to work with principals, curriculum, special education, as well as the Superintendent to ensure that the needs of all students are being met. Additionally, she will oversee matters dealing with human resources, labor relations, and professional development.

**George Anagnostou** was named the new District Treasurer. Anagnostou has 12 years of experience in government accounting. For the past six years, Anagnostou served as the Executive Director or Budgets and Grants for the Cleveland Metropolitan School District. In that role, Anagnostou developed and managed a \$732 million general fund budget and prepared the Five Year Forecast.

# **School Construction Updates**

The next phase of High School construction is underway and coming along! New roofing is almost complete in the 600 wing and exterior window replacements are ongoing. In all, the high school will have 66 renovated classrooms completed by mid-August in the 600, 700, and 800 wings of the building. The classrooms will be wireless and have interactive projectors and sound amplification systems. Construction continues on the Middle School and the project is on budget and on schedule for the Fall, 2016 opening. # State Budget Update-Strongsville Loses \$2.8 Million Over Two Years

Governor Kasich exercised his line-item veto authority and eliminated the hold harmless clause from the new biennium state budget. This decision means Strongsville will lose \$2.8 million in the next two years. The House and Senate versions of the budget bill had provisions that districts like Strongsville would not lose state funding.

"We're very disappointed. We were cautiously optimistic that we were going to be held harmless after the work that was done in the House and the Senate," said Superintendent Cameron M. Ryba. The final state budget will reduce funding in 2016-2017 for 100 of the wealthier school districts in Ohio.

Members of the Strongsville Board of Education testified before the state legislature this spring to make the case for Strongsville. The District will now have to make tough decisions about how to balance the district budget while losing nearly \$3 million over the next two years.
