They have grown so much since their first season with the team and they have left their mark on the basketball program.



During March, Advisory periods discussed female empowerment. Mr. Fehr's class were asked to find images that spoke to them.




ES: The second image is a pregnant woman and I know that women are not only for giving birth but the fact that women are strong enough to give birth shows a lot of what I think shows women empowerment.



Soccer Update!


