


HISTORY AND MISSION

As the premier all-boys boarding school in the country, Salisbury School has been educating boys in the English boarding school tradition and graduating young men of character for over 120 years. A small and tightly knit community founded in the traditions of the Episcopal Church, Salisbury strives to develop a boy's mind, body and spirit, deeply instilling the virtues of loyalty, honor, and service. In the classroom, in the dorm, and on the field, Salisbury transforms a young man's character to graduate confident, spirited, curious and loyal gentleman and brothers who make a difference in the lives of others well beyond the Hilltop. Boys leave Salisbury having calibrated their moral compass, which will guide them during their college years and in the world thereafter.



ACADEMICS

From its rigorous traditional curriculum to innovative programs such as Entrepreneurial Studies, Salisbury provides opportunities to learn actively and to be engaged and challenged through multi-disciplinary, experiential and project-based learning experiences. The School's distinctive course offerings are carefully designed to prepare students for the rigors of college and to think independently. The all-boys classroom nurtures the confidence to take risks and inspires growth.

The idea of supporting boys and individual learning profiles was innovated by Josephine Bauman Rudd more than 75 years ago. The Rudd Center for Learning and Academic

Growth is a well-established, standard-bearer academic support program that has aided in the academic success of Salisbury School boys since the 1950s. It has guides boys to become confident, independent learners who achieve academic success at Salisbury and beyond. Over the years, the program has grown to become one of the leading learning centers in New England. Salisbury also has the small class size and flexibility to challenge the most gifted students.

FACULTY – "Doing Everything Right For Boys"

The Salisbury faculty are experts at teaching and mentoring boys. As a school designed for boys, the emphasis on relational learning enables Salisbury faculty to build authentic relationships with each student. When a student feels known and valued, he is empowered to persevere through challenges and stay actively engaged. In Salisbury classrooms, on athletic fields and in social settings, teachers, coaches, and advisors challenge students to take risks, ask questions, and grow from mistakes. Teachers actively support students, providing time and attention during and outside of class and encourage boys to learn from, and with, their brothers. Faculty and staff view themselves as part of a community of learners who care for and support the

students and each other in all endeavors. Alumni look back on their experience at Salisbury as much more than just another chapter of their education, or a simple stepping-stone to college.



ATHLETICS

Salisbury's excellence in the classroom carries over to its athletic program. While fortunate to boast a number of New England and league championships in recent years, Salisbury School is most proud of its students and their commitment to being gentlemen both on and off the field. The development of a healthy body and healthy mind go together as critical parts of early education. As one of the most prestigious athletic boarding schools in New England, Salisbury treats academics and athletics with equal seriousness and encourages an environment in which healthy competition builds more productive and well-rounded individuals. Importantly, sporting events help cultivate Salisbury's brotherhood. The events create school-wide enthusiasm, build experiential friendships

and heighten Salisbury's strong sense of community. Just attend a Hockey game – you'll see!

Salisbury is fortunate to offer superb indoor and outdoor space for athletic and fitness activities and is one of the best-equipped sports boarding schools in Connecticut. Its extensive indoor and outdoor facilities are located on a spectacular 725-acre main campus. Faculty members serve as coaches to Salisbury's athletic teams and teach important lessons both on and off the field, and these close-knit relationships are at the core of the Salisbury experience.

ARTS AND MUSIC

Salisbury's Art and Music department offers both the inquisitive beginner and the seasoned artist and musician core curricular and electives that are customized to his interests. More than just a creative outlet, lessons in art literacy encourage students to consider the broader implications of art today. In addition to the studio courses offered during the academic day in fine arts, music, and digital media, students can participate in drama, music lessons and ensembles. The Ruger Fine Arts Center and the Field Music Center are easily accessible to students who are encouraged to take advantage of these state-of-the-art facilities during their free periods.





ETHICAL AND SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Founded in the Episcopalian tradition, Salisbury values Chapel as a central part of the school experience. Chapel on the Hilltop is the place where the School comes together to pause, to reflect beyond daily routine, and to consider one's spirituality. Salisbury honors the variety of faith traditions represented within the school community as well as the diverse paths of spirituality. As part of the School's mission to nurture the spiritual lives of the school community, everyone gathers for chapel two mornings each week. Typical services include music, readings, student musicians, a brief talk and a prayer. While the School hosts outside speakers, the most memorable Chapel talks come from within the school community: from a fellow student or from a member of the faculty or staff. Alumni from all

generations often refer to the Chapel as one of their most cherished and formative experiences at Salisbury.

CAMPUS LIFE

Salisbury School's vibrant community thrives on the concept of brotherhood, evident through its character-based approach to education and through its values and ethics-based culture that are reinforced not only in the classroom but through extracurricular activities and community gatherings. From the family-like dynamic between students and faculty, Salisbury's wide range of clubs and organizations, social opportunities, leadership and service, to its time-honored traditions, boys discover who they are, what they stand for, and develop the values that will stay with them through adulthood. The school fosters an inclusive environment where boys from many different economic backgrounds, races and cultures feel a very strong bond to their classmates that lasts well beyond their years at Salisbury.
