



# SCHOOL BASED LEARNING EXPERIENCE EXPECTATIONS

Rules and regulations for summer school will be enforced per the “Calvert County Student Code of Conduct.” If you are not already familiar with this document, you may obtain one at: <https://www.calvertnet.k12.md.us/departments/student-services/code-of-conduct>

**Purpose:** The High School Learning Experience Program is designed to meet the needs of students who were unsuccessful in one or more core courses during the school year. High school students in grades 9-11 who do not earn credit in a course during the school year have the opportunity to recover credit, connect with staff and ensure a strong foundation for relationships and future learning.

Public school students enrolled in grades 9-11 during the 2020-2021 school year may attend the CCPS High School Learning Experience Program at the school in which they are enrolled.

**Dates:** June 14 – July 1 (Monday – Thursday)

**Time:** 8:00-11:30 a.m.

**Attendance:** Since the High School Learning Experience lasts for only 12 days, it is very important that participating students maintain excellent attendance. **Credit will be denied if a student misses more than one day of summer school.** Students are not excused from class for dental appointments, camp, sports, or vacations. Students who cannot attend all classes should not enroll in courses for credit. Students are also required to be on time for every class. Those who arrive late or leave early may not earn course credit.

Students will attend all three weeks with the possibility of finishing the course in two weeks if all requirements are met. Students must attend the entire 3.5-hour session with no more than one absence to receive credit for the course.

**Credit Recovery Option:** Students will be able to select one of their four core subject courses. These courses will be offered through a blended approach using APEX and face-to-face instruction. Students will complete 75 minutes each day they are in attendance to work on the APEX platform. Throughout the morning, the subject area teacher will work with students in small groups to focus on specific content. Students will have a maximum of three weeks to meet content level standards and earn credit.

**Registrations:** Students must complete the attached registration form and turn it into the lead teacher or designated administrator at each high school. Registration will take place May 11 – June 10. Students unable to register for this session will be able to register for a course at the CTA Summer School Program.
