
The Distance Between Us (Young Readers Edition) by Reyna Grande*

Science Fiction & Fantasy

Ship Breaker by Paolo Bacigalupi*

In a future version on America's Gulf Coast, Nailer scavenges old ships to make ends meet until one day after a hurricane he spots a beautiful crashed ship and gets caught up in the adventure of his life.

Seraphina by Rachel Hartman*

Seraphina joins the castle as a musician but hides a dangerous secret—she is half human, half dragon, in a kingdom where tensions are high and there is barely peace between the two races.

The Interrogation of Ashala Wolf by Ambelin Kwaymullina*

Following an environmental apocalypse known as the Reckoning, the government in this futuristic version of Australia fears and detains "Illegals" like Ashala who have developed superhuman abilities.

Sabriel by Garth Nix*

Sabriel has always lived outside the Old Kingdom, away from the dead who refuse to stay dead. But now her father, the Abhorson, is missing, and Sabriel must cross into that world to find him.

Monstrumologist by Richard Yancey*

Will Henry works for a scientist dedicated to the study of monsters, but nothing prepares him for what happens when a grave robber comes knocking late one night.

Nonfiction & Graphic Novels

Almost American Girl: An Illustrated Memoir by Robin Ha*

After her Korean mother's decision to marry a man in Alabama, 14-year-old Chuna, grapples with culture shock, bullying, and integrating into a new family. It isn't until her mother reminds her of her love of comics and drawing that Chuna, now going by Robin, begins to thrive.

Titanic: Voices from the Disaster by Deborah Hopkinson*

This book chronicles the events leading up to, during, and after the Titanic disaster, including accounts from crew members and people traveling in first, second, and third class.

Stamped: Racism, Antiracism and You by Jason Reynolds*

This is NOT a history book. This is a book about the here and now. A book to help us better understand why we are where we are. A book about race. The construct of race has always been used to gain and keep power, to create dynamics that separate and silence. A timely, crucial, and empowering exploration of racism—and antiracism—in America

But when they turn to leave, rising floodwaters block their path out. Before long, news of the missing team spreads, launching a seventeen-day rescue operation involving thousands of rescuers from around the globe.

Dragon Hoops by Gene Luen Yang*

Gene doesn't get sports but he loves superhero comics. He lost interest in basketball long ago, but at the high school where he now teaches, it's all anyone can talk about. The boy's varsity team, the Dragons, is having a phenomenal season that brings them closer to their ultimate goal: the California State Championships. Once Gene gets to know these young all-stars, he realizes that their story is just as thrilling as anything he's seen on a comic book page.
