




Magnificat COVID-19 Safety Protocols



Wear a mask indoors unless actively eating or drinking.



Practice social distancing.



Practice good handwashing.



Stay home if you are ill and/or experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.



Current Exposure and Quarantine Requirements

Classroom environment exposure to a positive case*

Ohio Governor Mike DeWine announced in December, 2020 that students and adults identified as close contacts with a positive COVID case in the classroom setting do not need to quarantine if the following conditions are met:

- COVID-19 prevention policies such as mask-wearing, social distancing, handwashing, identification and management of students who are exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, routine cleaning and disinfecting procedures;
- The exposure was within a classroom environment or on school transport;
- The person with COVID-19 and those around were all wearing masks covering their nose and mouth; and
- Social distancing was maintained.
- All campers who were in a classroom environment will be notified of exposure and asked to monitor for symptoms.

What constitutes close contact requiring quarantine if exposed?

- People who are not vaccinated and have been in close contact with someone who has an “active” COVID-19 case are asked to quarantine (stay home and stay away from others because symptoms may not appear immediately.
- This would apply to exposure during lunch, athletic camps, or in a non-classroom environment.
- Close contact includes:
 - i. Anyone within six (6) feet for at least 15 minutes over a 24-hour period, or without a mask on;
 - ii. Direct physical contact;
 - iii. Shared utensils;
 - iv. Nearby when infected person coughed or sneezed;
 - v. A person who is providing care for someone who is sick with COVID-19 .

How long do I have to quarantine if I am a close contact?

- According to the CDC, the Ohio Department of Health, and the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, it is best practice for individuals must quarantine for 14 days to monitor for symptoms after an exposure to COVID-19.
- Notwithstanding above, Magnificat, in accordance with the guidelines from the CDC, the Ohio Department of Health, and the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, will permit students, faculty, and staff members who have quarantines due to an identification as a close contact to return to school or work:
 - i. Ten (10) days from the date of exposure to the positive case as long as the person has no symptoms; or
 - ii. Seven (7) days from the date of exposure to the positive case, with a negative PCR test.

* The guidelines above follow current guidance from both the Ohio Department of Health and the Cuyahoga County Board of Health. These guidelines are for the classroom environment only; if a student is identified as a close contact during lunch or extra-curriculars, regardless of mask-wearing, she will still need to quarantine.



COVID-19: What to do if your camper tests positive, has been in close contact, or has symptoms...

My camper has tested positive for COVID-19

My camper has been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19

Close contact = within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more

My camper has symptoms of COVID-19

temperature of 100.0°F+, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of taste and smell, chills, nausea, body aches, and/or runny nose

- 1) Report whether your camper has tested positive, has been in close contact, or has symptoms.
- 2) Report whether your camper will be streaming or taking a sick day.
Repeat this step for each day that your camper is not on campus.

Isolate for **10 days** after first symptoms

Return to school only when you have been **fever-free** and **symptom-free** for **24 hours**

Quarantine and monitor for symptoms per Quarantine Guidelines.

Contact medical provider

If positive, go through steps in first column.

For each of these scenarios, School Nurse Marybeth McCormick will follow up with parents and guardians to review guidelines and protocol. Magnificat is required to report the number of positive COVID-19 tests each week, but all names and personal information will be kept strictly confidential.



Isolation, Quarantine, and Return-to-Camp Guidelines

(For individuals who are not vaccinated)

If a camper has COVID symptoms or tests COVID+

QUARANTINE AND ISOLATE

- Report to Director of Summer Programs and School Nurse.
- Camper will be advised to be seen by a medical professional if she has not done so already.
- Camper should quarantine at home and isolate following CDC and Ohio Department of Health isolation guidelines.
- Magnificat will operate under the presumption that if a camper's family member has COVID-19, the student has COVID-19, even without symptoms or a positive test.

When can a camper return after COVID illness?

Camper can return when the following CDC Guidelines are met:

- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared;
- Camper is free of fever (without use of medication) for at least 24 hours; and
- Symptoms have improved;

—OR—

If testing is readily and easily available, a camper with a positive COVID test and no symptoms may return to school if all of the following have occurred:

- 10 days have past since positive test¹;
- She continues to have no symptoms; and
- She has had at least two negative tests at least 24 hours apart.²

When a camper exhibits COVID symptoms at camp

- Report to School Nurse in the School Clinic, now located adjacent to the Auxiliary Gym.
- School Nurse, wearing full COVID-19 personal protective equipment (PPE), will assess the student and her symptoms.
- Camper will be immediately isolated in the COVID-19 Isolation Clinic.
- As soon as possible, parents/guardians will be notified, and camper will return home.
- Until able to leave, camper will be monitored by a staff member wearing appropriate (PPE) and maintaining social distancing, as much as possible.

If a camper is exposed³ to an individual who is COVID+ or presumed COVID+ individual

QUARANTINE

Those in “close contact” with an individual who has or is suspected to have COVID-19 should report that to the School Nurse.

- Report to Attendance Coordinator and School Nurse.
- Student should remain at home to monitor for symptoms.
- If no illness or symptoms, student can return to school pursuant to CDC/Ohio Quarantine Guidelines.
