Learning Model





- Birth to age 2: special education services will return to in-home after July 1
- Early Childhood: 5 days a week 100% of students.
- Elementary: 5 days a week 100% of students
- Middle School: 5 days a week 100% of students
- High School: 5 days a week 100% of students

Specialized Education Services





Free appropriate public education (FAPE) will be offered and provided within all educational models. Students on IEPs or Section 504 Plans will receive equal access to education as their nondisabled peers.







- We will encourage those who are not vaccinated or feel more comfortable doing so to wear a mask, but it will not be a requirement of staff or students.
- Face masks will be required per federal mandate while riding the bus.

Physical Distancing





- There will be no physical distancing requirements.
- We will still cohort and pod when possible.







- We will still encourage and promote hygiene etiquette:
 - Hand washing
 - Cleaning off surfaces
 - Maintaining clean and healthy facilities
- Upgrade in our ventilation system







- We will continue to encourage staff and students engaged to test regularly.
- Ongoing partnership with Carver County Public Health to support access to immunizations.
- We will continue to coordinate with State and local health officials.







- We will continue working within the established guidance for contact tracing and try to be as accurate as possible in determining close contacts based on available information.
- Our new quarantine policy is 7 days with a negative test, 10 days if no test.







 Field trips/buses allowed, seats must be assigned to support contract tracing.

 Staff will evaluate best model to support contact tracing while allowing kids options to choose activities on a daily basis.
